
I am enclosing the nomination information pertaining to Adriane Diamond Travis of Marshall County High School.

Yes. She was inducted into the Marshall County Athletic Hall of Fame last week. Unfortunately, she was out of the country and could not be here to accept. However, she will be here to accept at next years induction ceremony. I have included her contact information below. Highlights mentioned at our induction ceremony were:

Marshall County High School's first Track and Field State Champion, winning four individual championships in the 400 meter dash between 1980-83 and also winning the 200 meter state championship twice. Diamond still holds the State Class AAA 400 meter record with a time of 55.50 seconds. She was an Indoor Track and Field All American at Indiana University in 1985, 1986 and 1987. At one time, she held the record for the fastest time in the world to date in the 600 meter dash. Diamond still holds the MCHS record in the 100, 200 and 400 meter dashes.

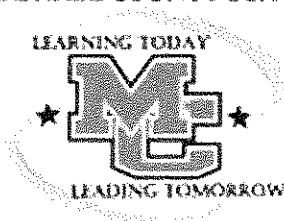

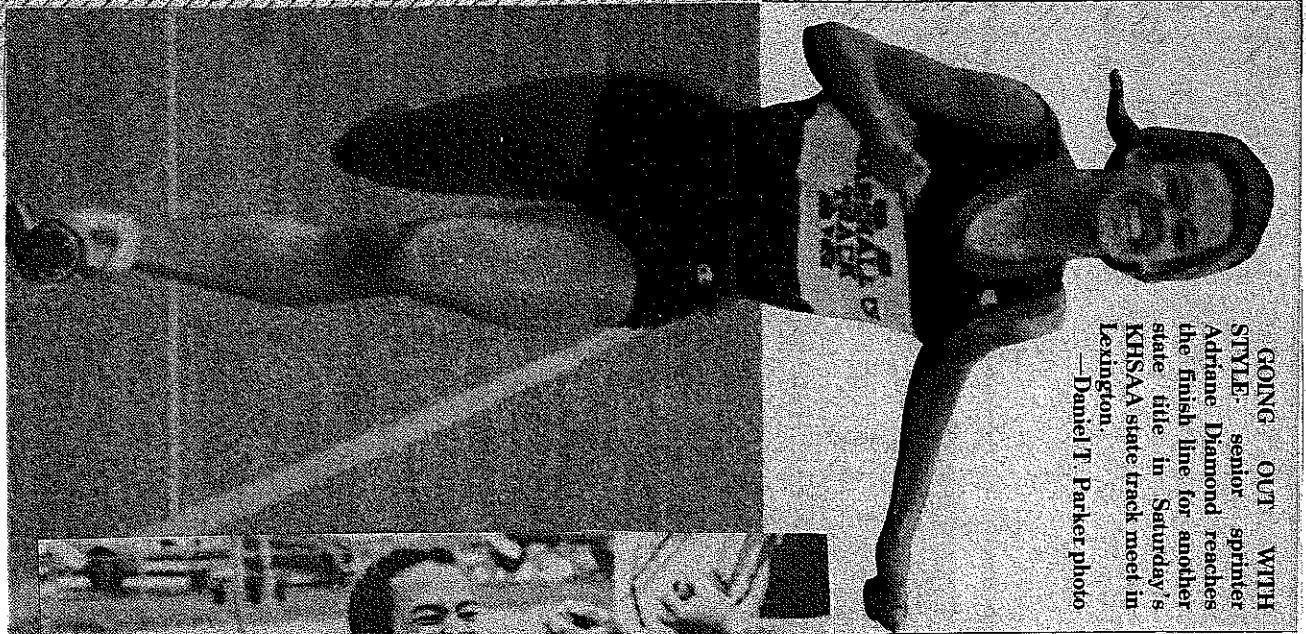

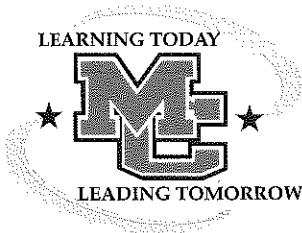

KHSAA Hall of Fame Selection Committee,

Please accept this as my nomination of Adriane Diamond Travis for induction into the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame. I can think of no one more deserving of this honor.

I had the privilege of running track and graduating from Marshall County High School with Adriane. She was always a top notch competitor but an even better person.

Adriane was a four time KHSAA Class AAA State Champion in the 400 Meter Dash. She set the state record for all classes in 1983. Twenty-Seven years later, this mark still stands as the Class AAA record. After high school, Adriane attended Indiana University on a Track and Field Scholarship. While at Indiana, Adriane was a seventeen time Big Ten Champion and an NCAA champion in 1986.

While running in college I occasionally had the opportunity to attend the same meets as Indiana University and catch up on old times with Adriane. In January of 1987 while attending the same meet, I was warming up for my event and had just witnessed Adriane blister the field in the 500 meter dash. I never will forget when the results of the 500 meter dash were announced, "and in first place, with the fastest time in the world to date, Adriane Diamond". That announcement sent chills down my spine and created a lifetime memory.

I know your decision to select the members of the KHSAA Hall of Fame can be very difficult.
