Preseason Player of the Year and first team All-American by Collegiate Baseball. **CAREER NOTES:** Could become the first three-time All-American in school history. Third player in Florida school history to earn All-America honors in back-to-back seasons. Ranks among the UF career top-10 in 16 offensive categories. All-time UF batting average leader with a career .396 mark (189-477). 32 career home runs, ranking as the second-best total in school history. Slugging Percentage of .681 (325 TB-477 AB) ranks second all-time. 139 career walks ranks as the second-best total in UF history. 10 saves ranks fourth all-time, tied with Paul Riddon. 11.1 strikeouts-per-nine-innings ranks tops on UF all-time charts. Reached base in every game of his career with at least one plate appearance. Led SEC in hitting as a freshman in 1996 with .407 mark. Reached base in a school record 130 consecutive games and has posted a current consecutive games reach safely streak of 133 consecutive games, setting another school record. Streak tested on March 21, 1997 against LSU before ninth-inning, two-out homer extended streak to 76 games. Reached on error in one game in 1996 prevented perfect reached base safely streak for career. Led the nation with 76 walks as a freshman.

Named SEC Player of the Week on April 21, the second time he has received the honor from the conference, 1997. One of two players to start every game. Held eight single season school records (Hit Streak, HR, RBI, Total Bases, Slugging %, Sac Fly), hit .465 with 28 HR and 74 RBI. Led the team in batting average, RBI and HR. 24 HR are the UF single season record. Led better than 1996 total (9 in 24 AB) and ranked third in the SEC. 75 RBI is the UF single season record. Recorded two of three top-10 single season totals in school history in first two seasons. At least one hit in 53 of 64 games, 29 multi-hit games on the season and 18 multi-RBI games. Posted a 11-1 record and a 4.56 ERA with four saves out of the bullpen, 25 appearances, overall with seven starts. 14 wins ranked sixth on the UF seasonal chart. Made seven starts on the mound with a 5-1 record with a 5.04 ERA (28ER/50.1inn.). Won last five consecutive decisions. Averaged 10.1 strikeouts per nine innings. Opponents hit just .246 against him. Errorless in the field in first 24 chances before first error against Florida. Only two errors overall in 308 chances. Among conference top-10 in six offensive statistical categories. Led SEC in walks (63), fourth in slugging (% (.767)), second in on base % (.500), fourth in HR (23), fourth in HR per game (0.36) and ninth in RBI (76). Home run in each of three consecutive games (3/17-21), tying UF school record accomplished five times, including once earlier in season by Mark Ellis. Posted a school record 26-game hitting streak that ended March 7 against Miss. State (0-4, 4K, BB) versus LHP Eric DuBose. Streak included last nine games of 1996 and first 17 of 1997. Broke UF record held by Bobby Forbes (1948, 24), the oldest standing offensive record. Third two homer game of the season against South Florida. Broke the UF single season HR record with 20th home run of the season against Georgia. Earned SEC Player of the Week honors on April 24 after hitting .750 (9-for-12) with doubles, 5 RBI, five runs scored and three stolen bases against Kentucky. Added a complete game in start in series opener against Kentucky, recording a career-high 11 strikeouts. Hit pair of home runs at Vanderbilt for second two homer game of the season. Came up single short of the cycle against Alabama with double, triple and HR. Hit grand slam against Miami to help UF to a 12-0 win and picked up the win in 2-1 game day after pitching 1 1/2 innings of scoreless relief. First two HR game of 1997 over against Santa Clara, 1996 Golden Spikes National Player of the Year Award nominee. Led a first team All-America team to a second team All-America selection by Baseball. Third-

team All-America selection by Baseball America. Also earned NCBWA Player of the Week. All-American (Outfield) honors. A second team All-SEC selection (OF). College World Series All-Tournament team selection. Most Valuable Player of the NCAA East Regional Tournament team. Received the Dave Fuller Award at annual team banquet. First Garry to hit 400 or better since 1965 (Scott Lusader, 400). SEC Batting Champion. Saw action in 57 games with 56 runs, 105 as the designated hitter, four in center field, 11 in right field, 15 as first base and 21 in left field. Hit .407 with 22 doubles, nine home runs and 65 RBI. Posted a 5-2 record with a 2.97 ERA in 10 relief appearances. Led the SEC with a .487 batting average, which is second all-time on the UF single season chart. Hit .414 with 57 RBI with runners in scoring position. Second on the team with 31 multi-hit games. Earned all-tournament honors at the CWS after hitting a team best .417 over four games, including a grand slam against Florida State on his birthday (6/1). Named to the all-tourney team at the NCAA East Regional after batting .563 (9/16) with two home runs and seven RBI, which also earned him Mizuno National Player of the Week honors (5/27/96). Threw 2-2 innings of relief and earned the win against North Carolina State. Came back the following day and shut down South Florida for 5.0 innings, allowing only four hits and striking out five. Had a team best 17-game hitting streak, during which he has hit .493 (35/71) with 11 multi-hit games, 21 runs scored, 21 RBI, nine doubles, three triples and two home runs that ended in the SEC Tournament opener. Wilkerson has played at the same position for an entire game 32 times while playing two positions 21 times, three different positions 12 times and in four spots one time. Hit a team-high 22 doubles, which is tied for the second best single season total. Team high 76 walks rank second for a single season at UF. Reached safely in 66 of 67 games of his UF career (in one game he made only pitching appearance) and has reached base safely in the last 49 games, entering the '97 season. Allowed an earned run to score in only 10 of 28 appearances. Struck out 67 batters in 63.2 innings of relief work. **PRIOR TO FLORIDA:** 13th round draft pick by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 1995 June Amateur Draft. Was named Tournament MVP on gold medal winning USA National Junior Team. Pitched three hit shutout and went 3-for-4 with an RBI at the plate in gold medal game at Kenway Park. Hit .395 with team high four home runs and was 5-0 with a 0.56 ERA during National Tournament. Fanned 41 and walked just 11 in 32 innings. Member of silver medal South Team at the USA Olympic Festival. Hit .500 (7-for-14) with a tournament high two home runs and nine RBI. Drew four walks to reach base 11 of 20

DID YOU KNOW...

- In 2007, the University of Florida became the first program ever to hold the national titles for men's basketball and football in the same academic year. Eleven Gator athletic teams turned in top-10 finishes in 2006-07.
- Florida and UCLA are the only schools in the nation to finish in the top-10 in national all-sports rankings every year since 1983-84, a span of 24 years.
- Florida ranks third among all Division I programs in total points accumulated in the 14-year history of the NACDA Directors' Cup. During that time, nine Florida teams turned in the maximum 100 points for a national championship.
- UF student-athletes have earned a total of 66 Academic All-America honors since 1992, including four in 2006-07.
- A total of 187 Gator student-athletes earned a spot on the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll in 2006-07. UF is the only SEC school to place 100 or more student-athletes on the Academic Honor Roll each of the last 10 years.

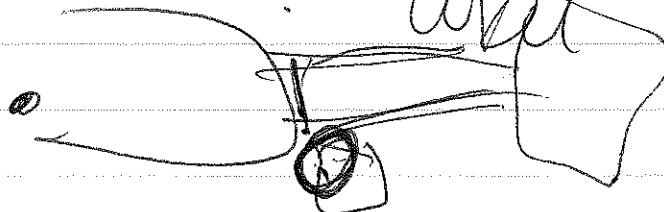

Brad Wilkerson's athletic ability was evident early, as he was the dominant soccer player for his age group in Owensboro, KY. It was baseball that Brad truly loved, and it was this sport that he ultimately chose to pursue more than all the other sports. As an 8th grader, Brad established himself as one of Apollo High School's top pitchers, culminating in a shutout win over arch-rival Owensboro Catholic in the district playoffs. Brad became the dominant player in Kentucky by his junior year, and he capped his senior season with three straight no-hitters in the high school playoffs and the award of Mr. Baseball.



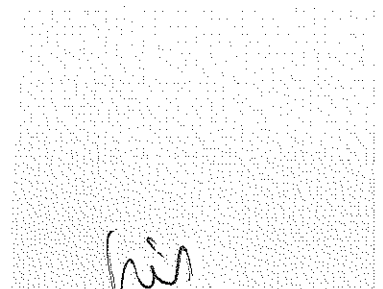

At the University of Florida, Brad made an immediate and dramatic impact. His Gators went to the College World Series, where Brad hit a dramatic grand slam to beat state rival Florida State. The Gators made a return trip to the CWS two years later in Brad's junior year. As a junior, he became the first player in college history to hit 20 home runs, steal 20 bases, and win 10 games as a pitcher in the same year. Brad was named the College Player of the Year by Rotary Smith.

Brad was named to the 2000 Olympic Baseball Team to play in Sydney, Australia. Brad played center field on a team full of future major leaguers. In one of the biggest upsets in Olympic history, Team USA defeated mighty Cuba 4-0 in the Gold Medal Game.

Brad made his major league debut in August 2001. He recorded his first major league hit off Greg Maddux and his first major league home run off Jason Marquis. In 2002 Brad hit 20 home runs, an Expos rookie record and was named Rookie of the Year by The Sporting News. Last year, Brad set career highs in home runs, RBI, runs scored, walks, doubles, and at bats playing all three outfield positions and significant time at first base.

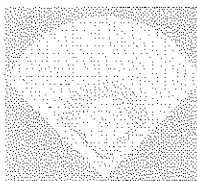
He was placed on the disabled list on Aug. 16 because of a strained right shoulder that ultimately required surgery. He hit .293 with seven home runs and 15 RBI in May, but .181 with five home runs and 20 RBI in his last 47 games and 149 at-bats. He hit .205 with runners in scoring position. He hit .150 (8-for-40) as a designated hitter and .233 as an outfielder. He batted .175 as a leadoff hitter and .259 in the No. 7 spot in the order. He was tied for 17th in the American League in strikeouts despite just 320 at-bats. His 3.15 plate appearances per strikeouts is the third highest in club history for a player with 350 plate appearances in a season. He had seven assists in 80 games in left field.
