

Donna Wolfe has been a leader in girls' sports as an athlete, educator, and coach throughout most of her life. At Holmes High School, she lettered all 4 years in volleyball, basketball, and softball, was President of G.A.A., and a member of the National Honor Society. As a college athlete, she, again, lettered all 4 years in volleyball and basketball and led the basketball team all 4 years in scoring. She was the co-winner of the Top P.E. Major Award, was a member of Collegiate Pentacle, a senior women's honorary, and Who's Who Among Students in Colleges and Universities. She graduated from EKU with High Distinction and was the first female to receive Eastern's Outstanding Alumnus Award for Athletics. Her softball prowess speaks for itself. She is a member of 3 different, softball, Hall of Fames: local, state and national. She is the only Hall of Fame member to have been selected as an All-American 5 times at 4 different positions.

As an educator and coach, she has championed equality for girls' sports, both, locally and statewide. She helped in forming the Northern Ky. High School Coaches Association and was one of 5 women responsible for the inclusion of girls' sports into the Northern Ky. Athletic Conference. On the state level, she was President of the KGSA 3 times and was a member of the Citizens' for Sports Equity Executive Board for 15 years. She was instrumental in getting volleyball and softball sanctioned as KHSAA state sports. In 1997, she received the Distinguished Service Award from the State Department of Education.

She coached volleyball and basketball and softball for years. She initiated the Fellowship of Christian Athletes at Holmes High School in 1995 and served as its sponsor the last 4 years of her teaching career. She has served as a KHSAA Girls' State Basketball Tournament worker for the last 31 years.
