If there was ever a coaching dynamic duo in Kentucky high school athletics, it has to be Reba and Paul Woodall. While teaching Health and Physical Education at Bryan Station High School in Lexington they met, then married. Paul was coaching the Boys Track & Field team; Reba began coaching the girls team. The rest, as they say, is history. This husband and wife team compiled an amazing record of accomplishments, making them equally and exceptionally deserving of induction into the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame.

Reba, a graduate of the University of Kentucky began her teaching career in Physical Education of Grant County High School in 1973. The following year she joined the property of faculty at Bryan Station, where she remained until her retirement in 1999. With her property of the husband as her mentor, she developed a coaching style that brought immediate success. Both on and off the field, she treated her team members with respect and genuine kindness. She modeled good sportsmanship by accepting wins and losses gracefully. Her teams were consistently in the running for individual and team titles as she built a reputation as one of the most successful Girls Track and Field coaches in Kentucky.

In 1974, her first Girls Track & Field team finished fourth in the state, then never looked back. The next four years in a row, her teams finished as state champions. At the end of her career she had accumulated an amazing string of wins that included six regional runner-ups, six regional titles, two state runner-ups and eight state championships.

As a well respected member of the coaching community, Reba served in leadership roles in Kentucky, nationally and internationally. In 1987-88 she was President of the Kentucky Track and Cross Country Coaches Association. During subsequent years she served as Regional Meet Manager, Sectional Meet Manager, Track & Field State Meet Official and an official for the Bluegrass Games. In 1993 she was part of the coaching staff for the Women's South Track & Field Team of the Olympic Festival in San Antonio and later was part of a national panel at the National Convention in San Francisco. In 1994, Reba was chosen as a member of the coaching staff for the World Junior Track & Field Championships in Lisbon, Portugal.

Coach Woodall has accumulated a long list of well-deserved honors and awards. She 19 was the KHSCA Girls Track & Field Coach of the Year eight times. In 1977 and 1980 was named the Kellogg's Girls Track & Field Coach of the Year and the following year in 1980 was honored as the American Motors Coach of the Year. Three times she was designated the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Regional Track Coach of the Year and in 1989 was named National Coach of the Year.

For her leadership and service she has received Service Awards from the National Federation of State High School Association and from the U.S. Women's Track Coaches Association. Her outstanding career was recognized in 1990 by the Kentucky Track &

Cross Country Coaches when she was selected for the Association's Hall of Fame. In 2002, she was inducted into Bryan Station High School's Hall of Distinction, honoring her years of dedication, her leadership and the exceptional personal characteristics that made her a role model for students, faculty and coaching colleagues.




