# Rebs host 'moonlighting' Newport

Ray Brown has a good feeling about his Newport High School baseball team. "The kids really want to do good in this tournament," says the head coach.

While raindrops and muddy grounds made practice almost impossible for the past five days, Brown's Wildcats weren't exactly goofing off.

"Monday and Tuesday nights the kids all went over to Lunken Playfield and got in some batting practice with the pitching machine they've got there," disclosed Brown.

"It cost each one of 'em three to four bucks to play the machines and (Jim) Cutter's been going over there for the last three days," said Brown. "I had forgotten all about it until he happened to mention it."

The Wildcats, 14-9 on the campaign, are all set to take on host Boone County in today's 8 p.m. nightcap of the northern Kentucky regional. Campbell County meets Holmes in the 5 p.m. opener.

lusty hitting for the rest of the week. The senior outfielder is clouting a torrid .596 batting average, with 40 hits in 67 trips to the plate.

Among those safeties are 12 doubles, two triples and four home runs, good for 31 runs batted in.

Brown indicated that he'd start senior righthander Dave "Beater" Schlosser on the mound. The skinny hurler owns a 6-1 season's record and a tough 2.15 earned run average.

Brown's crew isn't taking the Rebels lightly. "I told them that Boone County teams are always fundamentally tough because of Coach (Jim) Connor."
