Glasgow's Stuart Boys Tackle Weighty Problems

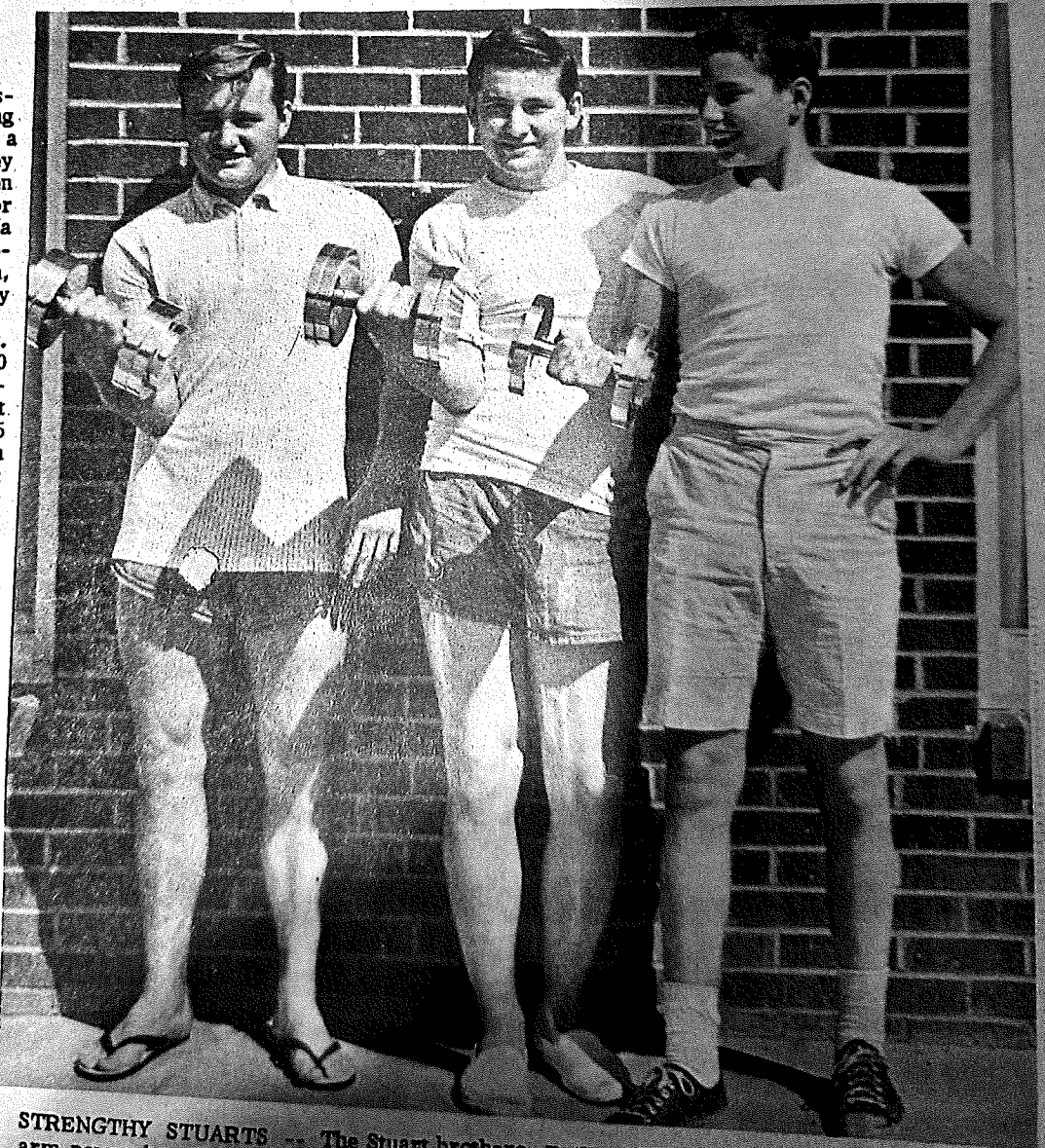
There is, in the city of Glasgow, a trio of weight lifting youngsters who represent a number of broken records. They range in age from fourteen to twenty years, from junior high to college. They have a combined weight lifting potential of almost one half ton, although the heaviest is only 195 pounds of boy.

They are the sons of Dr. and Mrs. John N. Stuart, 510 West Washington. Their identifications are, Brill, five feet eight inches tall weighing 195 pounds; John, five feet eleven inches tall weighing 190 pounds; and Jesse, five feet nine inches tall weighing 150 pounds.

Their weight training began when their father opened a health studio in the first floor of his residence, several years ago. The studio closed last year but the boys kept on working. And they have all shown improvement over the years.

Brill still holds the Glasgow High School discus record of 147 1/2 feet, which was the best high school discus attempt for 1963 in Kentucky. The same year, Brill set the school record for the shot-put, placing fourth in the state track meet. But Brill's shot record did not last long.

Just this past school term, sixteen-year-old John broke big brother's record with a throw of slightly over fifty-two feet. Already this summer he has made throws of over fifty-four feet. That is twelve feet ahead of Dallas Long's ninth-grade performance - (Long holds the national high school record for the "shot" at 69 feet thrown

Field Events Discussed Today

Preview Of Regional Track Here Thursday

EDITOR'S NOTE -- The following article is the first of three to be published this week on the upcoming Regional Track Meet Thursday, May 12th, here at the new track. Field events and the contenders for those titles will be covered today. Tomorrow's edition will contain an article on the dashes and hurdles events, and the final one the next day will describe the relay events and distance runs.

The track events, or running events, require speed and endurance. The field events also require speed (in the long jump), but usually the stronger boys go in for the shot put and discus, with springy legged boys interested in the high jump and pole vault. A track and field meet is composed of five field events and ten track events, so that the importance of a team doing well in the final standings is most dependent on their strength in the track events. However, when two of the strongest teams are about even in running, the field events can often spell the difference between victory and defeat.

Competition for Thursday's regional meet will be divided,

for the first time, into two classifications, A and AA, with the smaller schools in A and the larger ones in AA. Favored to win the AA competition are teams from Greensburg and Franklin. Greensburg appears to hold the edge in the running events, they are favored to capture three firsts there to Franklin's one or two. So with the running events apparently very even, the field events could very well go a long way in deciding the outcome of the meet.

The favorite in AA long jumping is Lee Vaughn of Greensburg. Vaughn won the S.K.A.C. long jump Saturday with a leap of 20 feet, 8 1/2 inches, longest in the region this year. The region's only other 20 foot man is Leon Goodnite of Franklin, whose best jump in competition has been 20 feet, 1 1/2 inches. The AA third and fourth spots should go to Phil Bomar of Adair County and Morris McKinney of Glasgow. Bomar jumped 19-8 1/4 in the S.K.A.C. Saturday and McKinney's best is 19-4.

In the A division, Hiseville's William "Rabbit" Curry has jumped 19-6 to install him as the favorite there. Close on his heels will be J.S. McDaniels of Park City, Terry Turner of Austin-Tracy, and Pau Mosling of Metcalfe County. All are 19

feet men and should be at their peaks on Thursday.

The AA high jump will be hotly contested, with the top four boys there having done about the same all season long. It's very hard to pick a favorite in this event, but the boy that has jumped the highest (though it was last year) is Mike Phelps of Bowling Green. Mike's best jump is five feet nine inches. Leon Goodnite of Franklin has done 5-7 1/2, and three boys, Jack Price of Bowling Green, Lee Vaughn of Greensburg, and Rex Bailey of Glasgow have done 5-7. Phelps will most likely have to jump 5-9 again if he expects to win.

The A division High Jump is not expected to be nearly as close as the AA because of the presence of Temple Hill's Joe Harvey. Joe has done 5-9 and it appears that the only two boys who might challenge him are Gary Allen of Park City, whose best is 5-7, and Rounte Pedigo of Hiseville, who has jumped 5-6. Harvey may be home free if he doesn't break a leg.

Larry Atherton of Larnie County is the favorite in the AA pole vault, having done 11 feet this year. He will be challenged by Milton Hammonds Franklin (10-3), James Heck of Greensburg (10-0) and Randall Smith of Greensburg (10-0). The pole vault is a very difficult, painstaking event and local fans should come out early Thursday afternoon to see it.

A division pole vault has two 10 foot jumpers in David Spillman of Hiseville and Joe Coats of Park City. Spillman, however, defeated Coats in their only meeting of the year in the Barren County Track Meet last week. Spillman vaulted 10-1 to beat Coats at 9-9. Also challenging will be Spear of Metcalfe County, who did 9-10 in

the S.K.A.C.

The AA discus throw should be won by Ernest Ferguson of Franklin, whose best toss has been 125 feet. Glasgow should furnish the next two contenders in Morris McKinney and Gene England. Both boys have thrown in excess of 120 feet in various meets, with McKinney winning the S.K.A.C. at 122-4 and England throwing 124 feet against Greensburg in a meet early last week. Jim McKinzie of Larnie County has done 118 feet, and should be close.

The Class A discus throw will probably be a contest between brothers John and Jesse Stuart of Metcalfe County. John finished third in the S.K.A.C. with a toss of 115 feet, eight inches and Jesse was fourth with a throw of 111 feet. Big Jerry Dunn of Gamaliel has the region's third best Class A throw with 105 feet, and may do better if he is able to get in enough practice before Thursday.

The region's best AA shot put is Gene England of Glasgow, who has a toss of 35 feet, 6 1/2 inches in competition and is expected to improve that mark by Thursday. Furnishing England the most competition should be Greg Shanks of Bowling Green and Bill Bushong of Tompkinsville who are both 43 feet shot putters. Jim McKin-

zie of Larnie County has done 41-6 and should be fourth.

The Stuart brothers of Metcalfe County are also expected to fight it out among themselves and Dunn of Gamaliel in the Class A shot put. John Stuart has a decided advantage over the other two boys, as he has thrown nearly 40 feet in competition and is capable of much better. Dunn may hold the second place edge over eighth grader Jesse Stuart, but the fight for that spot will be keen because both can toss the 12 pound ball around 45 feet. Joe Harvey of Temple Hill will also be close, having done 41-3 1/2 in last week's Barren County Meet.

This completes our discussion of regional field events. As mentioned, the sprints and hurdles will be discussed tomorrow.

Torres Batters Foe, Keeps Title

NEW YORK (AP) — Light-heavyweight champion Jose Torres hit tough Wayne Thornton with every punch in the book and scored two first-round knockdowns last night on the way to a lopsided unanimous decision in a rough 15-round title bout.

Thornton broke most of the rules and kept referee Johnny Lo Bianco busy most of the night warning him for his infractions in the first fight ever held in Shea Stadium.

Referee Lo Bianco scored it 12-21 and each judge, Artie Aldala and Al Berl, had it 10-14.

Torres raked Thornton's body with a left-right barrage and left him sagging on the ropes from a right-hand punch in the first round. Thornton, the No. 1 challenger, went down on his back, and rolled over. He barely made it up at eight.

The Puerto Rican-born New Yorker swarmed over Thornton and hammered him with both hands. When the Fresno, Calif., challenger retreated to his own corner, unable to defend himself, the referee began to count again. He went all the way for the mandatory eight-count before letting them go at it again.

A small crowd, estimated at 12,000,

turned out on a perfect night for the first outdoor fight in New York since 1960.

Thornton Raked Mercilessly

Although Torres never again dropped Thornton he raked him mercilessly in the eighth and drove home nine straight punches in the ninth.

The champ fought in spurts, whenever he could get his left hand loose from Thornton, who tried to hold that dangerous weapon all night long.

Thornton wrestled, held, heeled, hit low and used his shoulder on Torres

but never did any serious damage. At one stage in the eighth round after Torres landed a heavy series of blows, Wayne stuck out his tongue at the champ.

When Wayne cuffed Torres in the 13th, the champ merely laughed at him. Several times during the fight, Torres shook his head as though in disgust.

Lo Bianco was the busiest man in the ring, tugging at the 174-pound Thornton and the 175-pound Torres. He almost needed a crow bar to break Wayne's grip on that left hand. Once the referee had to warn Thornton to watch his language.

Western Ky. Wins League Track Crown

RICHMOND, Ky. — Western Kentucky won eight events yesterday en route to its third straight Ohio Valley Conference track and field championship.

Western amassed 822 points to runner-up Eastern's 67.

Records were broken in eight events and tied in one other.

Double winners were Western's Henry Wadsworth and Fran Smith, Murray's Jim Freeman and Eastern's Carey Guess.

Freeman was the meet's outstanding performer. The sophomore won the 100-yard dash in 9.4 seconds despite a 10 m.p.h. wind in his face and took the 200 in 20.8 seconds, the best time ever in Kentucky.

Smith scored a rare double, taking the 440 and 880. He also ran a leg on Western's record-setting mile relay team.

Guess, a Louisville Male High graduate, won the high hurdles yesterday after winning the triple jump Friday.

John Stuart Puts Shot 55 Feet

John Stuart, a junior at Glasgow High, hurled the 12 pound shot nearly four feet further than he had ever done before in competition Saturday, and still finished third in a special invitational shot competition at the University of Tennessee.

Stuart, the 1956 Class A state champion shot putter while at Metcalfe County, put the iron ball out 55 feet, two and one half inches in his best effort Saturday, but Chip Kell of Georgia won the competition with a mammoth put of 62-7 1/2.

Kell, the Georgia state champ and the National champ as well, has thrown as far as 66-8 outdoors, and the 230 pounder simply outclassed the four man field. All of the competitors were state champions.

Second, with a toss of 60 feet, one half inch, was Karl Salz, the Arkansas state champ, Stuart was third, and Tennessee state champ Don Donho was fourth at 54-6.

The 195 pound Stuart was "pleased with my throw, but not satisfied," said John. "We threw at 7:30 in the morning, and I wasn't ready to get up, much less turn in my best effort. But all things considered, I got a big thrill from just being at the meet."

The special shot competition was held in conjunction with a triangular meet between Tennessee, Alabama and Florida, which the Vols captured handily.

Stuart's immediate plans are centered about the Mason-Dixon Games in Louisville on Feb. 18th. He hopes to have a good shot at breaking the Mason-Dixon record of 56-6. This will be his third year of competition at Louisville and John hopes the "third time charm" will be working for him.

Bull, Lewis, Stuart Pace Impressive Scottie Track Win

School record performance by John Stuart and Dennis Bull, and a near record effort by Steve Lewis, highlighted a strong overall effort by the Glasgow Scottie track team Tuesday against Hixville and Austin-Tracy at the new track here.

When competition ceased, Glasgow had won with 73 points to Hixville's 58, and Austin-Tracy's eight. The Eagles were severely hampered by the fact that they only had four boys in the meet. Coach Jim Mann reported that between six and 10 of his students were home sick with the flu, and thus unable to compete.

But the last surprise of the meet was the performance turned in by Bull and Lewis of Glasgow. Despite the fact that Stuart broke the school's existing shot put record by over six feet, the times turned in by Bull in the 440 and Lewis in the mile run over shadowed the fairly 300 yarder's effort because they were so complete-

ly unexpected.

Bull clocked a near brilliant 10.2 seconds in the 440, and broke the old school record of 10.5 by almost three and a half seconds. Bull is new to this event, one of the toughest in track, and the best he had run previously was 11.7. Hixville's Ronnie Padgett, reigning champ in the Class A division of the Glasgow Regional, was second in Bull's 440.

Lewis, a converted two-mile, caused excitement in the mile run by coming in a 4:58.5 time, nearly 10 seconds better than he had ever run before. Lewis is only a freshman, and could have an extremely bright future ahead of him. The school record in the mile is 4:53, a mark held by Walter Chaplin, a circulation assistant at the Glasgow Daily Times.

Bob Douglas of Glasgow, one of Joe Morgan of Hixville for second place in the mile, as the Scottie junior clocked 5:11.5 in the mile run, because they were so complete-

ly unexpected. Morgan, who is only an eighth grader, was in large part responsible for Lewis' position. He set the pace for the first three quarters of a mile, and it is doubtful that there would have been able to set as fast a clip in the last. Like Lewis, Morgan is an unusually good young prospect, and should be heard from in future meets.

Stuart made a shambles of Glasgow's old shot put record of 56-4, two inches with a throw of 56-4 1/2. John had set the old record as a freshman, and would have broken it as a sophomore nearly seven years ago. Last year had he been a student at Glasgow, he was, however, a Morehead State student, but transferred to the Glasgow school for one year, while a freshman last year. Stuart won the Class A shot put competition at the Glasgow Open games held in Lexington. He also won the open competition shot at the Glasgow Open games held in February. So Stuart's run Tuesday wasn't exactly a surprise.

Stuart may possibly be the state's best shot putter this year, regardless of class.

Finishing a very creditable second to John was his freshman brother Justin, who also broke the old record with a throw of 51-4 1/2. Paul "Pug" Popper of Hixville was third at 45-3.

The time performance turned in by Scotties in the shot put, 440 and mile run definitely were the features of the meet, but several other boys from all three schools turned in an excellent variety of efforts as well. Old reliable Joe Hale was two events for the Scotties, finished second in the 100 yard dash, and third in still another one. Hale clocked 15.2 seconds in winning the 100 yard dash, and 31.3 in the 100 yard low hurdles. Hale was better in the 200 yard dash by Henry "Hoot" Hood of Hixville, as the Cardinal sophomore finished fast for a time of 34.2. Hale was timed in 34.5 seconds. Hale also competed in the high jump, and took third place with a jump of 5 feet, four inches.

Winner of the high jump was Ronnie Padgett of Hixville with a good 5-8 leap. Rex Bailey of Glasgow was second at 5-1. David Spilmon of Hixville won the 120 yard high hurdles in a good 16.9 seconds, noting an impressive Tony Smith, Spilmon's 11.5 second place finish to Hale in the low hurdles was also a good time.

Smith was the winner of the newest event in the meet. He recorded 37 feet, five inches in the Triple Jump, which is being run by Kentucky high schools for the first time this season. Glen Cline of Glasgow was second to Tony with three jumps totaling 36-11.

Austin-Tracy's lone first place finish came in the two mile run, where Joel Tracy finished in 11:22.6 to beat second place Jerry Johnson of Hixville by almost six seconds. The "wild man" Smith of Glasgow was third in the long endurance test with a clocking of 11:37.5.

Other Glasgow individual winners were Morris McKinney in the long jump at 16 feet, four inches. John Stuart in the discus throw at 130 feet, 1 1/2 inches, and Gerard Johnson in the 100 yard run at 21.3.

Hixville won both relay events, taking the 800 relay in 1:01.1 flat, and the mile relay in 5:55.1.

In all, Glasgow won eight of 18 events, and Hixville six. The Scotties won't run any more meets that week due to the break for REA, but have probably their toughest week of the season next week when they will take part in four meets. Included in the week will be a Tuesday meet with regional strong boys Franklin-Simpson and Greenburg, and a Saturday trip to Owensboro for the Christian County Invitational.

The Cards must see action Wednesday against Temple Hill and Park City at the oval here, and the Eagles are scheduled to face Park City and Temple Hill here on the 24th.

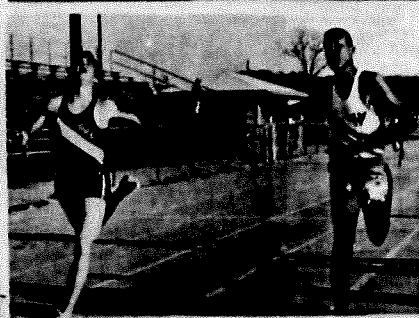
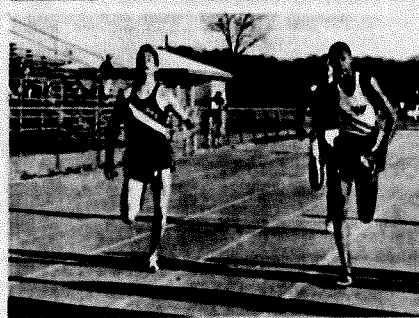

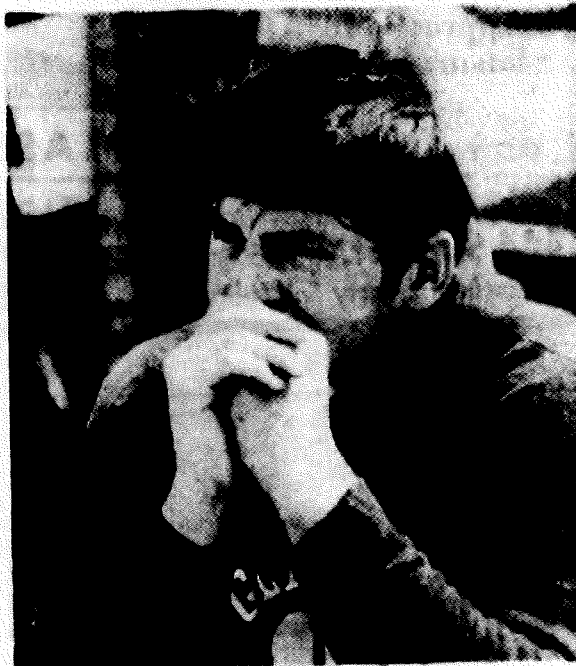
