

Tim Davis coached high school basketball in Central Kentucky for four decades, beginning his head coaching career at Marion County High School in 1983 and held that position for twelve years, before moving to Campbellsville High School in 1995/96. During his tenure at Marion County, Davis won 215 games and lost 136. His teams won 4 district titles, finished as district runner-up four times, and reached the 5th region finals three times, winning titles in 1992 and 1993. The 1993 Marion County Knights finished the year with a 38-2 record, won the prestigious Louisville Invitational Tournament, and captivated the state by winning the Kentucky High School Basketball State Championship. Marion County was the first team from the 5th Region to win the state title.

In 1995/96, Coach Davis took the head boys basketball position at Campbellsville High School, where he coached for the next 24 seasons, before retiring after the 2018/19 season. Davis retired as a special education teacher and has also served for the last fifteen years as Athletic Director. During his tenure as CHS coach, his teams won 386 games and lost 312. The Eagles won eight district championships and three times finished as district runner-ups; they also reached the 5th Region finals twice (1997 and 2010), and won 8 All "A" regional titles. Davis finished his coaching career with a record of 601 wins and 448 losses. His 601 wins currently places him 25th overall in the history of KHSAA basketball.

Coach Davis received numerous awards during his career. He was named 5th Region Coach of the Year four times. In 1993, he was named the Kentucky High School Boys Basketball Coach of the Year. He also has been voted NHSACA Region 3 Coach of the Year and was a finalist for NHSACA Coach of the Year two times. He was also inducted into the National High School Coaches Association's Hall of Fame in 2017. Coach Davis was named the head coach for the Kentucky All-Stars in 2008 for the Kentucky-Indiana All-Star game, the longest-running all-star game in the United States, leading Kentucky to a split with Indiana in the two game series. With the win against Indiana in the second game in Louisville, the Kentucky team ended an eight game losing streak against the Hoosiers.

Coach Davis currently serves as an Advisor for the Kentucky High School Coaches Association Executive Committee and has also served two terms as the organization's president. Has been a committee member for 20+ years and also serves as a member of the 5th Region Policy Board, a position he has held for over 20 years and currently is the organization's treasurer. Coach Davis also serves on the Board for the Kentucky High School Athletic Directors Association as the 5th region representative, a position held for the last 8 years. In 2022, Davis was named 5<sup>th</sup> Region Athletic Director of the Year and was also named Kentucky Athletic Director of the Year. He serves on the Board for the All A State Committee as the 5th region representative, a position held for the last 15 years. Coach Davis has been a member of the 5th Region Athletic Directors Association since 2012; serving one term as president. Last, but not least, he has been a member of the 5th Region Basketball Coaches Association for over 25 years, serving as president for 8 years and currently assists as an Advisor and Treasurer for the organization.

Coach Davis has been married to his wife, Joni, for 46 years and they have two children. One son, Ben, and his wife Stephanie, have two children: Cash and Lylah. Jordan, a daughter, is married to John Jessie and they have three sons: Beckett, Nolan, and Sutton.
