After a stellar high school career, Marla continued to shine at Eastern Kentucky University. As a Lady Colonel, she joined the prestigious 1,000-point club, demonstrating her consistency and scoring ability. Her senior year was particularly impressive; she earned 1st Team All-OVC honors, averaging 19.6 points and 3.75 assists per game. Marla was instrumental in leading the Lady Colonels to the NCAA tournament for the first time in the program's history in 1997 and played a key role in EKU's back-to-back regular season OVC Championship teams in 1996-1997 and 1997-1998. In recognition of her outstanding contributions, she was named EKU's Female Athlete of the Year in 2000.

Marla's love for the game didn't stop at the collegiate level. She transitioned into officiating, where her influence continued to grow. Notably, she officiated the Girls State Tournament Championship Game in 2007 and made history as the first female to officiate the Boys State Tournament Championship Game in 2010.
