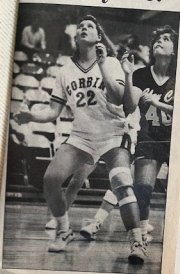
## Good one

## Goodin hits new record of 46 points

The Corbin Lady Redhounds used a school record setting performance by center Jarce Goodin, as the 6'1" junior scored 46 points to lead the Lady Redhounds to a 77-45 victory over the Whitley County Lady Colonels.

Goodin's record came at the 3:32 mark of the fourth quarter when she connected on one of two free throws to put Corbin up 77-40.

The 46 point performance surpassed the former Corbin record of 45 set by Corean Wells.

"It was a great feeling," Goodin joyced. "I was nervous and shaking when I shot the free throws. The crowd got into the game and their standing ovation felt great."

Goodin credited her accomplishment to her teammates.

"I could have never achieved the record with out the help of my teammates. They were unselfish and wanted to get the ball to me. I think the record will stand for awhile, but if someone gets it that means they had a better game than I did."

Corbin opened the first quarter with a full-court press and quickly ran off an 8-0 spurt with Goodin scoring two baskets while Tonya Taylor added a lay-up.

Over the next six minutes the Redhounds outscored Whitley 22-8 as Goodin picked up 22 first quarter points to lead Corbin to a 28-8 lead at the end of the first period.

Pam Smith scored two baskets while Lisa Creekmore and Tammy Mahan each picked up a basket, as Whitley connected on 19 field goals and made 6 of 16 free throws for 38 percent.

The Redhounds hit 32 field goals and made 12 of 17 free throws for 71 percent.

"We got out to an early lead," Corbin Head Coach Gerald Foley said. "Our defense played tough, and I believe it was the difference in the ballgame."

Goodin added seven points in the second quarter as Corbin outscored Whitley 16-11 to hold a comfortable
