

Dear Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame Committee,

I am writing to formally recommend Coach Jeff Lendon for induction into the KHSAA Hall of Fame. Coach Lendon's contributions to high school soccer in Kentucky are nothing short of remarkable, and his legacy as a coach and mentor has left an indelible mark on the sport in our state.

Coach Lendon, a Michigan native, ventured to eastern Kentucky in the late 1970s to attend Morehead State University, drawn by the reputation of their soccer program. During his time at MSU, he had the privilege of meeting Dr. Mohammed Sabie, often regarded as the "Father of Soccer in Kentucky." Dr. Sabie, an esteemed professor and the founder of MSU's club-turned-varsity soccer program, ignited Lendon's passion for "the beautiful game."

In 1978, Coach Lendon began student teaching at Mt. Sterling Elementary, where he introduced soccer to the youth of Montgomery County. He founded the local recreation soccer program, and launched the first-ever boys and girls varsity soccer teams at Montgomery County High School in 1983. As part of the program growth, he also founded the soccer program at McNabb Middle School as a feeder to his high school program. Under his guidance, the MCHS Indians Boys Varsity Soccer program quickly rose to prominence, reaching state championship matches in 1989 and 1994, competing valiantly against formidable big city opponents Ballard and Saint Xavier.

Over his 22-year tenure as head coach, Coach Lendon transformed Montgomery County Indians soccer into a regional and state powerhouse. His leadership led the program to five state semifinal appearances, two state championship appearances, numerous regional championships, and produced numerous NSCAA (now United Soccer Coaches) high school All-Americans. With a final record of 245-210-22 and a 51.4% winning percentage, Coach Lendon ranks 14th on KHSAA's Most Coaching Wins list for Boys' Soccer.

Notably, Coach Lendon's influence extended beyond his direct coaching role into coach mentorship. Two of his proteges went on to become successful high school soccer coaches. Former assistant coach Kevin Wright went on to coach West Jessamine Girls Soccer leading them to two KHSAA state championships. Assistant-turned-Indians head coach for 14 years, Nick Pannell, who is now head boys varsity soccer coach at North Oldham High School, ranks among the top 25 in all-time wins in KHSAA Boys' Soccer history.

Outside of high school soccer, Lendon coached club soccer for the Central Kentucky Storm and was founding member, former president and chairman of the Kentucky High School Soccer Coaches Assocation; including setting up and running the state's first all-star games.

As the volunteer marketing director for the Montgomery Co. Boys Soccer, a former player under Coach Lendon, and a sports media professional, I wholeheartedly believe that Coach Jeff Lendon is more than deserving of induction into the KHSAA Hall of Fame. His pioneering efforts, dedication to the sport, and the profound impact he has had on countless young athletes make him a true icon of high school soccer in Kentucky.

Thank you for considering Coach Jeff Lendon for this prestigious honor.
