Re: Nomination of Mr. Ken Hurt for the KHSAA Hall of Fame

Dear Members of the Selection Committee,

It is my privilege to recommend Mr. Ken Hurt for induction into the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame. Few individuals have had such a profound and lasting impact on high school athletics in the Commonwealth, both as a player and as a coach, as Ken Hurt.

As a student-athlete, Mr. Hurt excelled first at Lancaster High School from 1962–1964, and then at Garrard County High School from 1964–1966 following consolidation. In just two years at Garrard County, he scored 659 points, a total that still ranks him 35th on the school's all-time scoring list despite only playing two seasons. His achievements on the court laid the foundation for what would become a lifetime dedicated to education and athletics.

Mr. Hurt served as the head girls' basketball coach at Garrard County High School from 1978 to 2003. Over those 25 years, he compiled a remarkable record of 443 wins against 260 losses, a .622 winning percentage. His 443 victories place him 24th all-time among girls' basketball coaches in Kentucky history. Under his leadership, Garrard County won 16 district championships, 1 regional championship (1994), and finished as regional runner-up in both 1984 and 1993. His teams also captured back-to-back 12th Region All "A" championships in 1993 and 1994. Remarkably, in 25 seasons, his teams advanced to the regional tournament 22 times, a testament to his consistent excellence and ability to prepare his players year after year.

Beyond basketball, Mr. Hurt contributed to Garrard County athletics in multiple roles, serving as head baseball coach and assistant football coach for many years.

His commitment to student-athletes was not confined to the playing field; he was equally dedicated as an administrator. He served Garrard County High School as assistant principal and athletic director for many years. From 1999 to 2003, I had the privilege of working alongside him when I served as principal of Garrard County High School and he served as my assistant principal and athletic director. In these roles, he demonstrated the same leadership, character, and devotion to students that defined his coaching career.

Mr. Hurt served the KHSAA as a Board of Control member during his final years as a school administrator. He provided the same characteristics in that role as he did in all of his other roles as an educator.

Mr. Hurt continues to serve the Garrard County Schools and community. He is currently a member of the Garrard County Board of Education. At the end of his current term, he will have served in the role for 10 years.

Ken Hurt's legacy cannot be measured only in wins and championships, but in the countless young people he inspired and guided through athletics. He has been a coach, mentor, educator, and role model, leaving an enduring mark on Garrard County High School and Kentucky high school athletics as a whole.

It is for these reasons that I recommend Mr. Ken Hurt for induction into the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame. His career exemplifies the values and excellence that the Hall of Fame seeks to honor.
