



Frank is the 4<sup>th</sup> winningest coach in KHSAA boys soccer with a record of 267-125-24 from 1985 to 2005. His trophies include 3 regional titles, 1 final 16, 1 final 8, 1 final 4 and 3 time Area Coach of the Year. He also served on the KHSAA Soccer Rules Committee for three years. Frank Sloan always turned out winning team and did so in an admirable fashion which won him the respect of the athletes, parents and school administration. He is a leader and exemplifies the type of character in a coach that can produce a winner. He has the desire to succeed. This trait is strengthened by his positive attitude toward achieving his goals regardless of the sacrifices and hard work involved. He is a man of high morals and a credit to the community of Ashland.
