



Brigette Combs athletic career information:

Kentucky's Ms. Basketball and Female Athlete of the Year in her senior season, Brigette Combs led Whitesburg High School to three-straight state tournament appearances, including a 39-1 record as a sophomore before losing to Warren Central in the state finals. Combs also, grabbed a game high 21 rebounds against Louisville Atherton in the same tournament while posting 16 points and 16.5 rebounds per game her sophomore year. Under Combs play, the Lady Yellowjackets accumulated a 99-8 record as Combs scored 2,672 points, grabbed 1,920 rebounds and had 585 steals in 4 years. Her junior year she was selected to the All-Tournament Team at the prestigious B/C All Star Basketball Camp, an invitation only camp recognized as the Nation's all time premier basketball camp for elite athletes. Shooting 54 percent from the field and 71 percent from the free throw line Combs averaged 27 points and 14 rebounds per game leading Whitesburg to a 29-3 record as a senior. She was named KODAK All-American, National High School Coaches All-American and Milky-Way All-American. Winning three 14th Region Titles, she was selected to the All State Tournament team three times, 1st Team All-State twice while earning All-Region three times and All-District honors on four occasions. Brigette's talents did not stop there as she was also successful in track and field becoming Region and Sectional Champion in the 100 meter hurdles and 300 meter hurdles while claiming 3rd in state high jump. In 1991, Combs was inducted into the Kentucky All-Star Hall of Fame with Rex Chapman and in 2001 she was named one of the Top 25 Players in Kentucky Girls' Basketball History.
