I am pleased to nominate Tenesha Blakey Marshall for the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame. I had the pleasure of knowing and working with Tenesha as her guidance counselor while she was a student at Valley High School in Louisville, Kentucky. Tenesha was an honor roll student and a class officer during her years at Valley High School. She exhibited a tremendous work ethic in every activity she participated in while a student in high school. Tenesha was not only a good student but also an outstanding track athlete and basketball player at Valley.

I have listed some of her track accomplishments while she was a student in high school and later at the University of Kentucky and University of Louisville. From 1991 to 1994, Tenesha won 10 state titles. During her Freshman year, she set a regional record in the 300 Meter Hurdles, a record that still stands today. She also placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 300 meter hurdles and 5<sup>th</sup> place 100 meter dash. Her Sophomore year at the state track meet, she won 1<sup>st</sup> place in the 300 meter hurdles, 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the 100 meter dash, 1<sup>st</sup> place as a member of 800 meter relay team and 1<sup>st</sup> place as a member of the 1600 meter relay team. She continued her winning tradition in her Junior year at the state track meet winning 1<sup>st</sup> place in the 100 meter hurdles, 1<sup>st</sup> place in the 400 meter relay, 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the 1600 meter relay and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the 300 meter hurdles. She also was the winner of the 400 meter hurdles at the National AAU Meet in Nashville, Tennessee. As an added honor that year she was named the Kentucky Gatorade Athlete of the year in Track-n-Field.

During her Senior year Tenesha continued to win events in the state track-n-field events held in Lexington, Kentucky. She won 1<sup>st</sup> place 100 meter dash, 1<sup>st</sup> in 100 meter hurdles, 1<sup>st</sup> in 200 meter dash, 1<sup>st</sup> in 300 meter hurdles and again named Gatorade Athlete of the year in Track-n-Field. She was also named Outstanding Female Athlete of Year in Kentucky and was the first female athlete to win four gold medals in individual race events.

As a result of her efforts in high school, Tenesha received a full track-n-field scholarship to the University of Kentucky in 1994. During her time at U. of Ky. (1994-95), she set the Freshman school record in the 400 meter hurdles and was an alternate on the 400 meter relay team for national track events. 

The Lady Cardinals, second to Laurel County in basketball, finished No. 1 in Class 3A of the Girls' State High School Track and Field Meet at the University of Kentucky's sun-baked Shively Sports Center.

"I'm excited about it," said Elaine Farris, in her eighth season as the Clark County coach. "We've only got five athletes that performed today."

Of the five, only eighth grader Caprice Gay was not a member of the basketball team. The four two-sport stars: Maisha Thomas, Tara Caywood, and sisters Stephany and Tiffany Davis.

Clark County's 52 points edged Louisville Valley's 48. Next were Boone County (39), Pulaski County (37) and Bryan Station (34).

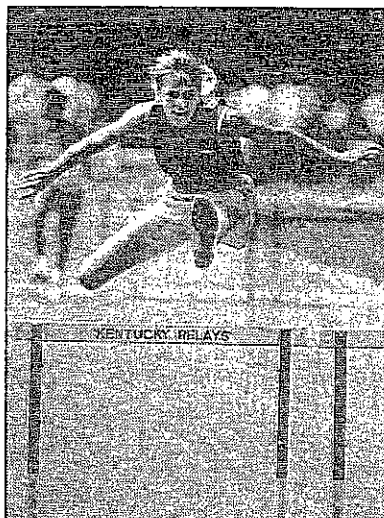

Other double winners in 3A were Daviess County's Daniell Leonard in the shot put (38.3) and

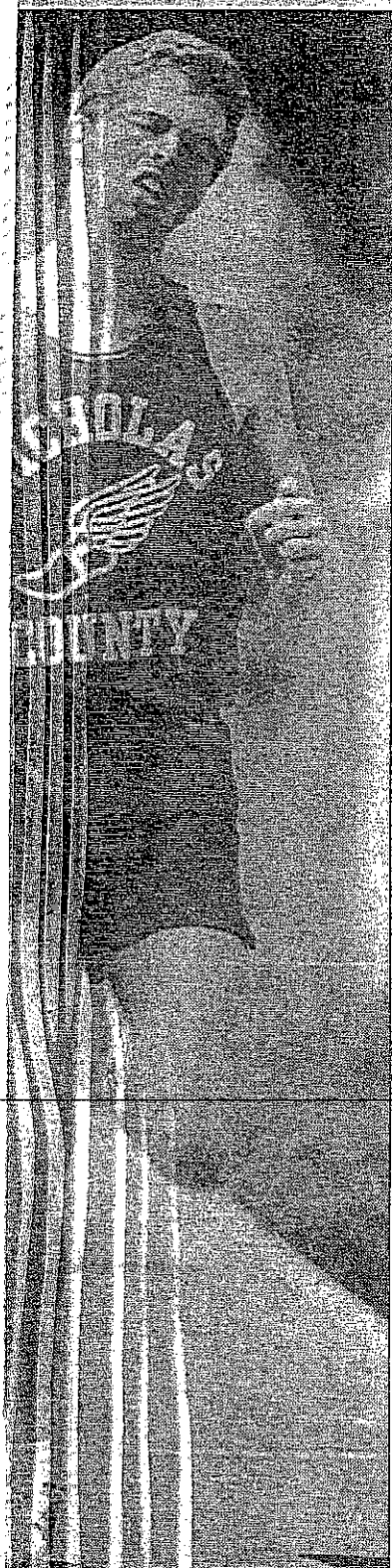

# Valley teen is on track

## Talented senior Shandy Boyd shines brightly in several events

With credentials such as student body president, volleyball team manager, yearbook editor and basketball point guard, Valley High School senior Shandy Boyd looks like a student to send colleges into a recruiting war.

But those colleges will have to stand in line behind the ones boasting the best track programs in the country, because the 18-year-old is also arguably the brightest track star in Kentucky.

She has won the state championship in long jump three years in a row. She holds the Class AAA state record in the 100-meter high hurdles. She holds the record for the long jump in the Mason-Dixon Games regional meet, in which she also won the 55-meter hurdles and the 55-meter dash. Sports Illustrated named her an All-American in 1991.

And in this year's track state championships at the University of Kentucky on Saturday, Shandy will try to sweep the 100-meter hurdles, the 200-meter race, the long jump and the 400-meter relay.

Valley track coach William "Chico" Underwood likes Shandy's chances.

"Anything can happen. You can have a bad day, fall down." But "I don't see anybody beating her."

Assumption coach Joe Medley said Tricia Hamilton's victory in the 1600-meter race highlighted his team's performance. She finished in 5:41.8, almost four seconds ahead of Amanda Lynch of Ballard.

"We're not nearly as strong as Valley," Medley said. "And we have several people hurting from injuries, but we've done a fairly decent job today."

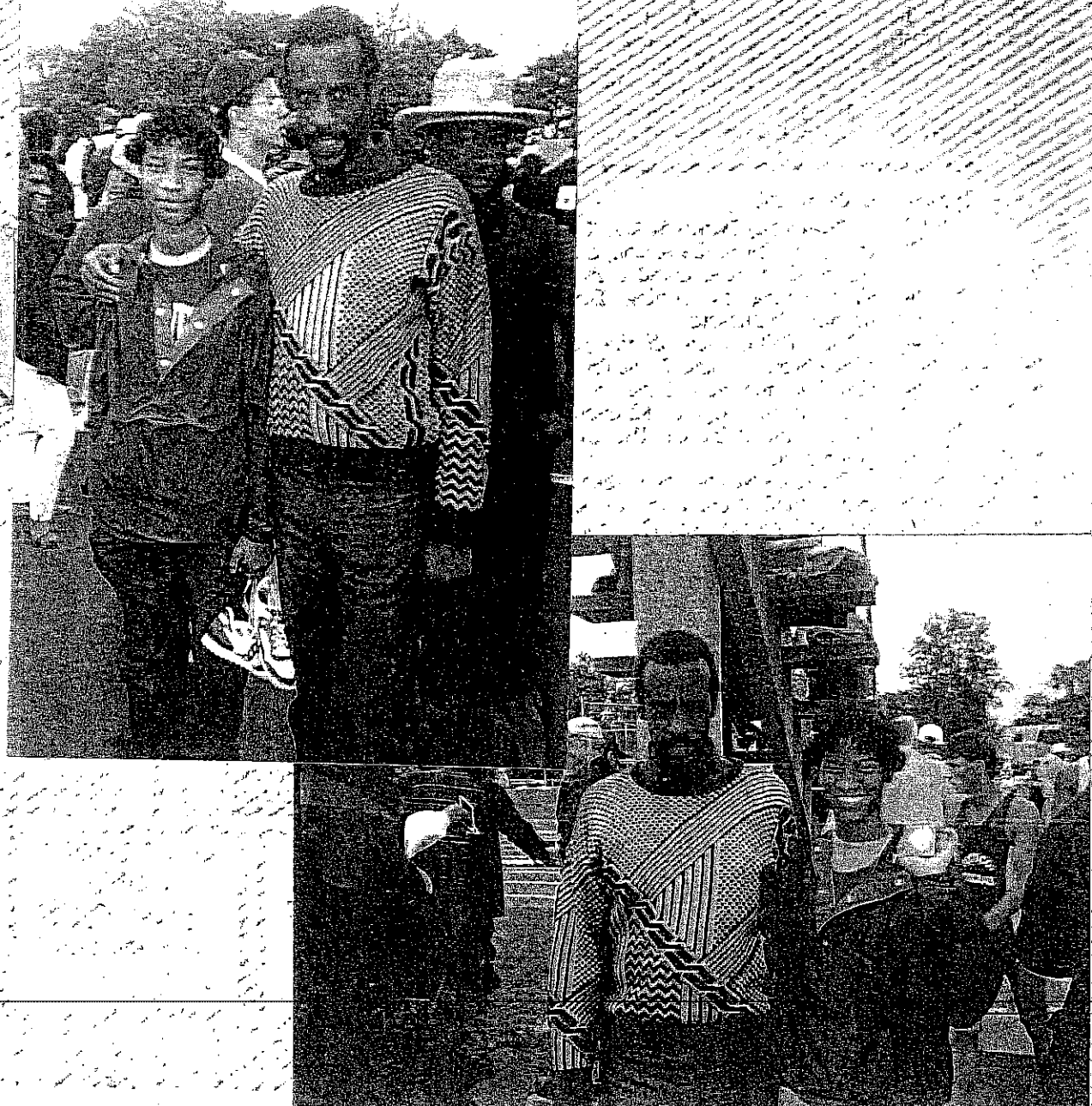

# Thrice a runner-up, Menendez finally wins to give Eastern title

Rondel Menendez of Eastern High School kept finishing second yesterday, but he never gave up.

Menendez was runner-up to Brian Rasberry of Male in the 100 and 200 meters and to Male's Mark Miller in the 400.

On the last lap of the final event — the 1,600 relay — Menendez rallied Eastern from third place to victory. That gave coach Mike McCoy's Eagles a 73-72 triumph over defending state Class AAA champion North Hardin in the Eastern Relays.

Menendez passed the North Hardin anchorman on the next-to-last curve and held the lead the final 200 meters. Eastern was third behind North Hardin and Male when Menendez took the baton.

"I knew we could win it when I saw him giving up on the curve," Menendez said. "Once I passed him, I knew he couldn't catch me."

Eastern turned in the state's fastest time this year, 3 minutes, 24.6 seconds, with North Hardin second in 3:25.4. Going into the last event, Trinity and North Hardin were tied with 64 points. Eastern had 63.

"It's about time I won," Menendez said. "I got all my fastest times today, but I was running second. It was pretty much a good day."

Rasberry, the National Junior Olympics champion in the 100 for 15- and 16-year-olds, ran in his first invitational after sifting out most of the season with a pulled hamstring. He overlooked Menendez in the final 10 meters to win the 100 in 10.7, then kicked strong to win the 200 in 21.8.

"I got a terrible start in the 100," Rasberry said. "Menendez was ahead almost to the finish. It felt good to come back and win my first race."

Menendez, who ran 10.8 and 21.9 in the 100 and 200, was second again when Miller — a sophomore — won the 400 in the state's best time of 48.7. Menendez ran 49.2.

# Trinity, Valley girls win team titles at track and field championships

Trinity and Valley's girls won team titles at the first Jefferson County Track and Field Championships last night at Male, but they had to share the spotlight with individual standouts Troy Copeland of Eastern and the Male party of Brian Rasberry, Mark Miller and Sheri Bowman.

"We came out of the field events with 51½ points so that gave us a strong lead," Trinity coach Chuck Servino said. "We won six events — four of them running events — so this is a solid track team. We scored in some places we hadn't been scoring. This was a super meet."

Trinity swept the distance races with Andrew Lorenz winning the 800 meters,

Brian Schaap the 1,600 and Sam Gaunt the 3,200, and it won the 3,200 relay as well. That helped the Shararocks to a 101½-point total, beating Male's 83.

Eastern, led by Copeland's three blue ribbons in the 110-meter high hurdles (14.9 seconds), triple jump (40 feet, 8 inches) and 300 hurdles (39.6), was third with 79½ points.

"The only event I really did my best in was the 300 hurdles," said Copeland, who erased his previous best of 40.6 seconds.

Valley, the defending state Class AAA girls' champion, got 1-2 finishes from Tanesha Blakey and Shonna Johnson in the 100 and 300 hurdles, and easily won with 118 points. Sacred Heart edged Male 74-73½ for second.

"In the invitational meets, Tanesha and I usually take turns on which hur-

dles race we run," Johnson said. "We both qualified for both hurdles because we'll both be running them in the regional and State meets. We have to get used to it."

Blakey welcomes the competition.

"It makes my times better," she said.

"We give each other a push."

Valley coach Chico Underwood says he hopes Blakey and Johnson can team up to score 16 points in each of the hurdle races in the State Meet.

Rasberry, the defending state AAA champion in the 100, won that race and the 200, but he got his biggest kick out of anchoring Male's 400 relay to victory. With Rasberry running the relay for the first time this year, Male lowered its

# Marshall, Baum zoom in Sectional Two meet

COVINGTON, Ky. — Boone County's Michele Marshall, the two-time defending Class AAA state champion in the girls' 1,600- and 3,200-meter races, used yesterday's Sectional Two track and field qualifier as a tuneup, handily sweeping the distance races at Scott High.

In the boys' Class AAA competition, Johnnie Baum of Louisville Holy Cross held off Boone County's Eric Van Laningham in the 800 and 1,600 to establish himself as the runner to beat when he defends his titles in both events at Saturday's State Meet in Lexington.

**Girls:** Marshall started her sweep by winning the 3,200 in a personal-best 11 minutes, 19.5 seconds. When coach Tim Schlotman admonished her about the quick pace, Marshall said, "I didn't mean to."

What she didn't mean to do was run at such a clip that she won by almost a minute and a half over teammate Jennifer Anderson.

"She ran a little faster today than I wanted her to," said Schlotman.

"Coach wanted me to take it easy this week," Marshall said. "I wasn't supposed to push myself. I wanted to run relaxed."

The 3,200 offered a look at things to come, with Marshall in front early and late.

"I like to sprint out and start a pace," she said.

Marshall also set the pace in the 1,600 to win in 5:19.8, with Mercy's Jill Willett second in 5:40.6. In the 800, Marshall and Willett again finished 1-2, in 2:25.5 and 2:36.2, respectively. The runner-up finishes were good enough to qualify Willett in both State Meet events.

After sweeping the three distance events, Marshall looked ahead to Saturday, with an eye on adding the

800 title to her list of accomplishments.

"I tried to push this one," she said of 800. But she added: "I do better as the distance increases. I keep up the same steady pace."

Marshall's performance led Boone County to the team championship with 143 points. Valley, boasting sprinters as impressive as Boone County's distance squad, finished second with 126 points.

"I thought we had a really good day," said Schlotman, whose Rebels qualified for 10 State Meet events.

Valley was led by Shandy Boyd, who won the long jump (17 feet, 4 1/2 inches) and 100 hurdles (14.5) and anchored the winning 400 and 1,600 relay teams.

Last year Boyd won three individual State Meet events: the 100 high hurdles in a state-record time; the 400 and the long jump. Her presence made Valley a threat, but this year the Lady Vikings are deeper.

**Boys:** Van Laningham ruled early, winning the 3,200 in 9:56.9, well ahead of runner-up Chet White of Holy Cross (10:22.8). After that he was chasing Baum.

Baum made his intentions known early in the 1,600, passing Van Laningham on the second of four laps.

"I was trying to run a good time today," said Baum, who finished in 4:23.7 to Van Laningham's 4:24.3.

"On the second half I was tired. I was counting on him being tired (after the 3,200). I think I could have held him off if he made a move."

The 800 was a shorter version of the same song. Baum got out early, then held off all challengers to win in 2:01.4. Van Laningham was second in 2:02.4, qualifying him for all three of the distance races in the State Meet.

Covington-Holmes won the team title with 137 points, led by Dwight

### 2 Male, Valley stars ready to get the track season out of the blocks

In more than a decade as Westside Track Club's coach, William "Chico" Underwood has worked with many talented runners.

Jefferson County gets the chance to see two of them represent their high schools when track season begins later this month.

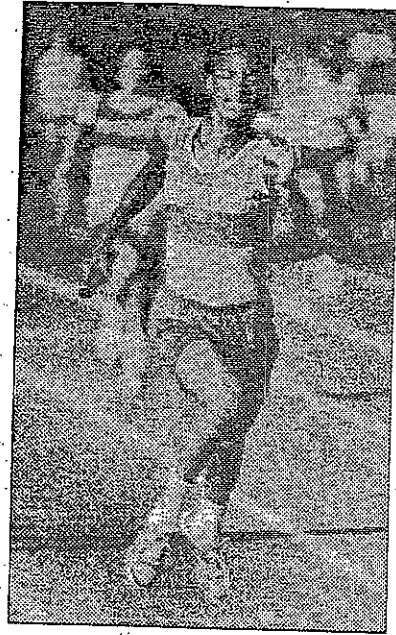
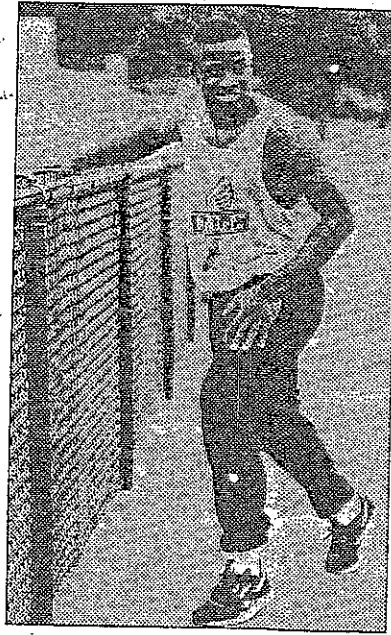
Sprinter Brian Raspberry, a Male High School senior, has his sights set on breaking the state record in the 100-meter dash.

And Tenesha Blakey, a senior at Valley High School — where Underwood is the girls' track coach — returns to defend her state title in the 100 hurdles.

"Brian and Tenesha are two of the best around," agreed Underwood, of the Shawnee Park area.

"Brian probably is the best individual we've had since I've been here," said Male coach Jim Bartman. "We've had a long history of good team performances, but individually, he's the best sprinter we've had."

Brian, of Rolling Hills, claimed state championships last season in the 100- and 200-meter events and was on Male's championship 400-meter relay team. "The 100 is my favorite," Brian said. "The state high school record is 10.58 seconds. I ran it in 10.30 during a (AAU) meet in the summer."

Bartman believes Brian has a shot at breaking the 100-meter record. "Our goal is that he keep progressing until the state finals," Bartman said. "He knows... this is his last chance at it. I'd like to see him do it."

Underwood thinks the 400 will be Brian's best event in college.

"Brian's start isn't the best," the coach said. "But he's been working on it. He's kind of like Carl Lewis... once he gets going, he's tough."

Tenesha, meanwhile, won the 100 hurdles last season and anchored Valley's state championship 400-meter and 800-meter relay teams the past three years. As a freshman and sophomore, she was state champ in the 300 hurdles.

"She's just a great all-around athlete," said Underwood, whose team captured the state title in 1992 and posted second-place finishes last year and in '91. "She also is the captain of the basketball team and was the captain of the cross-country team in the fall."

And she "is ranked 10th in her

class academically."

With the Valley girls' basketball season ending just last Thursday with a regional tournament loss, Tenesha, of the Shawnee neighborhood, acknowledged that she is a little behind in training for track. But she's been in the same situation in previous years.

"I've been doing some track work on my own at home," she said Friday. "But I'm going to take three or four days off before I start practicing with the team."

Tenesha said she expects this year to run the 100 and 300 hurdles, along with the 200 and mile relay, and, occasionally, the 100 meters.

"There's kind of a lot of pressure when you run that many different events, but I'll do whatever Coach asks me," she said, adding, "The 300 hurdles is my favorite event and probably the one that I'm best in."

Underwood said Westside, an Amateur Athletic Union member, currently has about 100 members, from 7-year-olds to high school students. Membership costs \$35 a year, which includes an AAU card and the chance to compete in 10 to 12 summer meets. For information about the club, call Underwood at 776-8626.

# Blakey leads Valley girls to Derby Invitational title

## HIGH SCHOOL TRACK

Tenesha Blakey doesn't run her best in cold, rainy weather, but it doesn't stop her from winning.

Blakey won all four races she entered last night while leading Valley's girls' team to its second straight Derby Invitational track and field championship at Ballard.

"The rain throws me off a lot, and my times aren't good," Blakey said. "I worry about slipping."

Blakey didn't falter at all, winning the 100-meter hurdles in 15.2 seconds, the 300 hurdles in 46.7 and the 200 dash in 26.4. To top her night off, she pulled out a victory in the final event, the 1,600 relay, to assure Valley its triumph.

Valley, which trailed Cincinnati's No. 1-ranked team, Princeton, 51-41 before Blakey won the 200, finally outpointed the Ohio power 74-66.

"We were third and about 50 yards behind when Tenesha (who ran the anchor leg) got the baton," Valley coach Chico Underwood said. "She ran a 59-second split. That's pretty good on a day like this."

Blakey was pushed hard by Michelle Williams of Paul Dunbar in Lexington to win the 100 hurdles.

"When I saw her next to me, I didn't panic," Blakey said. "I ran my own race all the way through."

Eastern, led by Tamika Townsend's victories in the 100 and 400 and second-place finish in the 200, was third with 58 points.

Floyd Central, always one of Indiana's cross-country powers, scored well in the distance events and compiled 40 points for seventh place in the 17-school field. Hollye Bryant won the 3,200 and ran third in the 1,600. Floyd Central also won the 3,200 relay.

Carla Prewitt, a senior from Lexington Bryan Station, not only broke the meet record in the shot put with a throw of 47 feet, 10 inches, but she bettered the State Meet mark of 46-4 set by Kym Hampton of Iroquois in 1980.

Hampton also set the meet record of 42-9½ that year.

Prewitt set the mark on her last throw, after going 45-11¼ on the previous attempt. The inclement weather didn't help her.

"The circle was slippery, and I had to get a towel to wipe my feet off," said Prewitt, a 5-foot-5, 155-pound senior who won the state Class AAA shot put the past two years.

While 47-10 was her best-ever throw, she's aiming to do better.

"That's OK right now, but I want to reach 52 or 53 feet," she said.

Reba Woodall, Bryan Station's coach for 20 years, said there are reasons why Prewitt succeeds.

"I've never had a harder worker," Woodall said. "She's the last one off the track. Her technique work is excellent. She's quick, and this year she made a big jump because she's been lifting weights."

Townsend won the 100 in a slow 13.1 and the 400 in her best time of 58.8, but she ran second to Blakey in the 200.

"In the 100, I didn't know where the finish line was, and I had a slow start," Townsend said. "In the 400, I sprinted the first 200 and had a strong finish. My previous best time this year was 59.4."

Townsend never has beaten Blakey in the 200.

"I'll catch her when I improve my start and run the curve better," Townsend said.

Princeton coach Ken Meibers said he learned his track while attending Union College in Barboursville, Ky., but that's not the reason his team competed here for the first time.

"The wife (Sharon Walker Goodwin) of Ballard's coach (Chris Goodwin) ran track for Princeton and was our first state champion, and Chris invited us," Meibers said.

Blakey. "After the Mason-Dixon Games, Eastern offered me a full scholarship in track."

It is evident that Blakey likes to stay busy. In addition to maintaining a 3.6 grade-point average (based on a 4.0 scale) and being active in many extracurricular and sports activities, Blakey holds down a part-time job. She offers this advice to her younger sister and to her friends: "Believe in yourself and the goals you set can be met."

Obviously that philosophy has served Blakey well.

More rounded is right. With more quality sprinters than many college programs, Valley amassed 185 points to runner-up Holy Cross' 107.

"That's all I have," Underwood said of his sprinters. "I don't have any distance runners."

That was obvious. Valley won 12 of the 16 events, placing 1-2 in five of them (the top two advance to the State Meet). The Lady Vikings were shut out only in the 800, 1,600, 3,200 and shot put.

Holy Cross won the four events Valley didn't. The Lady Cougars' efforts were highlighted by Kristal Kinnunen's triumphs in the 800 (2 minutes, 32.6 seconds) and the 1,600 (5:40.4).

Two races demonstrated how Valley's speed dominated. In the 400 relay, the Vikings finished in 52.0 seconds, well ahead of Western's 54.3. In the 1,600 relay, Valley clocked 4:05, breaking Central's

"It's easier if you have a balance, but you can do more with sprinters," said Underwood.
