Starting with the 1980-81 season, he started travelling and doing the book for all Augusta road games. In 1983- 84, he became the Augusta Panthers full time bookkeeper. Starting in about 1996, Brian has kept the book for all teams, both middle and high school, both boys and girls and both home and away. His dedication to the program is unwavering and his commitment to his job is unmatched. For nearly 40 years, Brian has been counted on by numerous coaches in numerous sports, and he has never let Augusta Ind. down.</p> <p>Brian's front row seat the past 40 years has put him in position to witness many great players and games. Some of the more memorable games, according to Brian, were the Panthers 1<sup>st</sup> round victory over Mason Co. in the 39<sup>th</sup> District Tournament, the Lady Panthers capturing the 1993 District title by beating Bracken Co in the Augusta Gym and the 1979 Lady Panthers win the District title and Regional Runner – up.</p> <p>Brian has been recognized repeatedly for his dedication to Augusta Athletics. In 2003, he was elected to the Boys 10<sup>th</sup> Region Hall of Fame and in 2004 the Girls 10<sup>th</sup> Region honored him with his 2<sup>nd</sup> Hall of Fame selection. This past summer, Brian was also inducted into the Northern Kentucky Sports Hall of Fame. There is absolutely no one more deserving of these honors, and we are very proud and honored to call Brian Flaughter an Augusta Panther.</p> <p>Brian is still currently keeping book for all of our basketball teams, baseball team and softball team.</p>
