

## KHSAA Hall Of Fame Nomination Committee

It is an honor, at this time, to nominate Robert “Roboo” Walker for the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall Of Fame.

Roboo was a three time State Champion in the sport of Track and Field. In 1985, he was the third leg of the 400M Relay State Champions. The foursome set a then State Record with a time of 42.9 seconds. He was 4<sup>th</sup> in the Long Jump and 6<sup>th</sup> in the Triple Jump. In 1986, Roboo won the State crown in the Triple Jump with a jump of 44 feet 4 and-a-half inches, and the Long Jump with a jump of 22 feet 8 and-a-half inches as a senior at Harrison County High School. This capped off a regular season in which he was undefeated in both events. He also finished second as a member of the 400M Relay Team and third at the State Meet in the 100M Dash. At the end of his senior year, Roboo was named the Northern Kentucky Outstanding Male Track Athlete of the Year.

Currently, Roboo is the Track Coach at Harrison County High School. He led the Thorobreds to a Regional Team Championship in 2012. In 2018, he will reach 20 years of coaching Track and Field. He has coached two State Championship athletes, compiling 5 Individual State titles, in his tenure.

The athlete turned into the teacher. Many KHSAA fairy tales are written this way and Harrison County High School is proud to say they still have a few chapters left to tell in their story. It is with great pleasure that I nominate Robert “Roboo” Walker for consideration for induction into the KHSAA Hall Of Fame.
