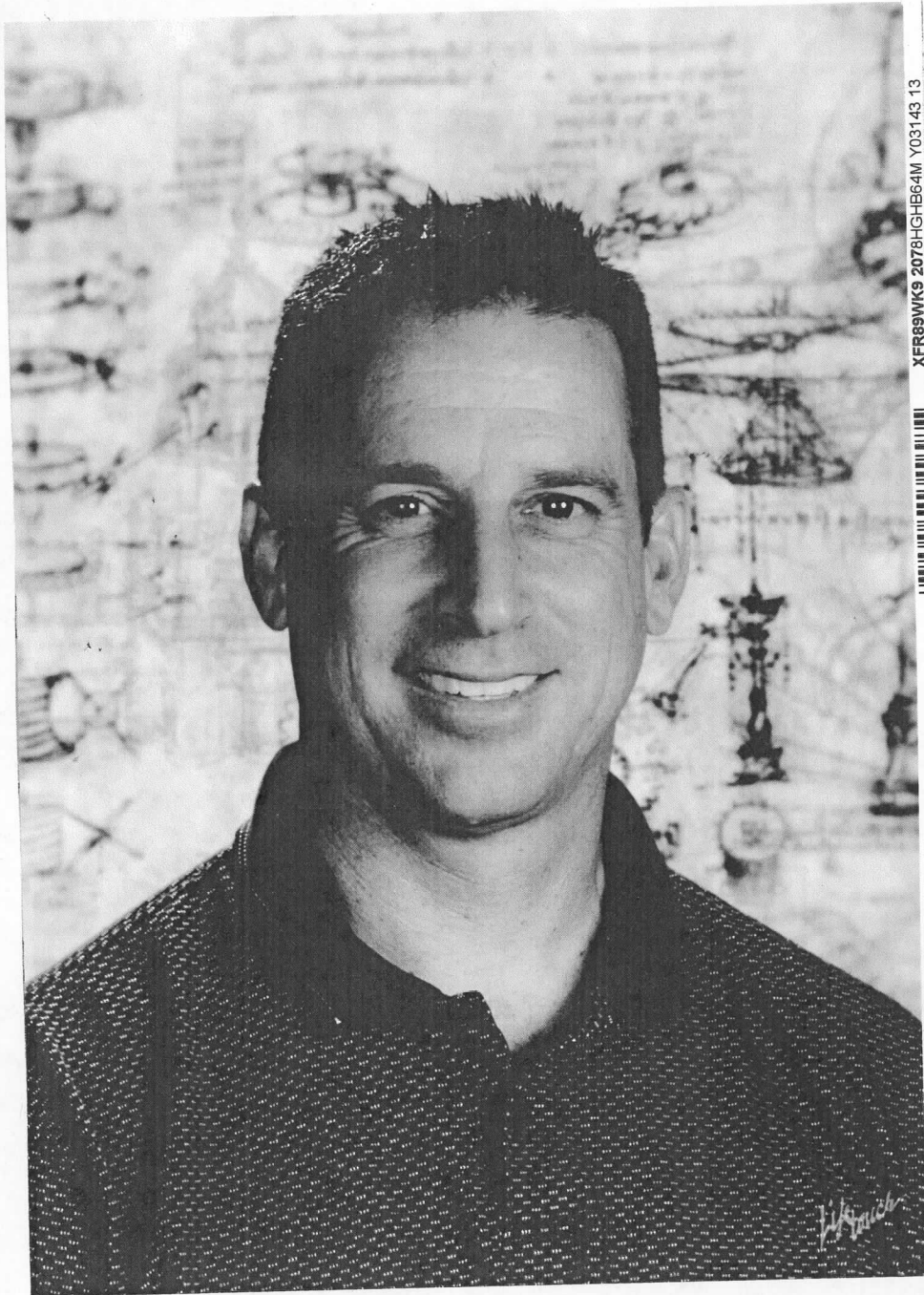

### Greg Brohm Highlights:

Greg Brohm was an outstanding student athlete at Trinity High School in Louisville KY where he excelled in football, basketball, and baseball.

He especially excelled in football as a wide receiver. He never dropped a catchable ball, and many, many times made uncatchable balls look catchable.

In 1987, his senior year, he was selected to the **1<sup>st</sup> Team Courier Journal All-State Football team** and the **1<sup>st</sup> Team Associated Press All-State football team** while teaming up with his brother, All State Quarterback Jeff Brohm, for many big-time passes.

He also received the prestigious OUR BOY Award presented by the Louisville Coaches Association.

As a marked man in his senior year of high school, all Greg did his was catch 51 passes for 893 yards for a team that held the #1 ranking in the state of Kentucky for several weeks. He had a 2 year total of 89 catches for 1,626 yards and 13 touchdowns. Greg was also a valuable contributor on the 1985 Trinity State Championship football team – catching 2 key passes as a sophomore in a playoff comeback from 14-0 down to defeat archrival St. Xavier 17-14.

He also was selected to play in the Kentucky-Tennessee All-Star Football Game.

**The Courier Journal selected him the 3<sup>rd</sup> best receiver in the last 35 to 50 years in the State of Kentucky (December 26, 1996 Courier Journal edition, Bob White).**

He also starred in Basketball (starting point guard) and Baseball (starting Outfielder and also at Catcher & pitcher) at Trinity High School.

Baseball – 1<sup>st</sup> Team All 7<sup>th</sup> Region senior year batting over .400 leading the team in hits, doubles, and stolen bases(Trinity was 7<sup>th</sup> region runner-up in both Jr. & Sr. yr.)

**Greg, a 3-sport athlete, also graduated 2<sup>nd</sup> in his class of 300+ students at Trinity High School.**

**Greg was also 1<sup>st</sup> Team Academic All-State in Football, Basketball, and Baseball.**

**He also received a Presidential Academic Fitness Award signed by President Ronald Reagan.**

**He then started at Wide Receiver under Coach Howard Schnellenberger** for 3 years at the University of Louisville where he once again teamed up with Jeff Brohm for many passes. Greg was the starting wide receiver for the historic Cardinal team that went 10-1-1 and defeated Alabama to win the 1991 Fiesta Bowl Championship.

**Ray Buchanan**, All-American defensive back at the University of Louisville, on TV, when being asked who was the **most difficult receiver that he had ever had to cover**, he answered “ **Greg Brohm**”.

Perhaps Greg's best performance would come in 1987 in his Senior Year in High School against a nationally ranked and defending State Champion St. Xavier High School team before approximately 20,000 fans at Louisville's Cardinal Stadium. After a series of penalties, the Rocks faced a seemingly insurmountable 2nd down and 52 yards to go for a 1<sup>st</sup> down. Greg went on to catch two long passes in a row facing a deep secondary coverage to give Trinity a first down on the 1-yard line. Greg's brother, Jeff, would run it in from there for the Touchdown, and Trinity would go on to upset the favored Tigers 21 to 0. That conversion on a drive facing 2<sup>nd</sup> and 52 via passes from Jeff to Greg would serve as the catalyst for this huge Trinity upset. Greg would finish that victory vs. the Defending State Champions with 6 receptions for over 100 yards, as Trinity snapped the Tigers long winning streak.

Greg's successful career in high school and beyond as an athlete, student, and citizen was recognized by Trinity High School in 2006, as he was inducted into the Trinity High School Hall of Fame.

**Some of his other highlights are:**

Member of the WHAS Radio Broadcast Team for University of Louisville Football games for 10 Years 1994-2003. (Sideline reporter and pre and post-game radio broadcast)

President of the Louisville Fire Arena 2 football team in 2003-2004. Also an assistant coach on those teams.

Director of Football Operations for University of Louisville Football Team 2004-09 under Coach Bobby Petrino. During his time as DFO at Louisville, the program won 2 Conference Titles, achieved 2 AP Top 10 National Rankings, and won both the Liberty Bowl and the Orange Bowl.

First Head Football Coach at Thomas Nelson High School – 2 seasons (guiding them through their first two seasons as a school and start-up program). Was also previously an assistant football coach at both Trinity and DeSales high school.

Director of Football Operations for Western Kentucky University Football Team - 3 seasons. During his tenure at WKU, the Hilltoppers went 30-10, won 2 consecutive C-USA titles, and won 3 consecutive Bowl Games – finishing the 2015 season ranked in the AP Top 25.

**Part of Brohm Family, awarded with the inaugural Howard Schnellenberger Family Award by the Louisville Catholic Sports Hall of Fame.**

Has been Host of a Radio Sports talk show and a TV Sports talk show in the Louisville media market.
