Dear Committee Members;

It is a great pleasure for me to write in support of Greg Brohm's Nomination and Selection to the KHSAA Dawahares Hall of Fame.

I have seen Greg Brohm play sports his whole life, and he always stood out. I coached him in Youth and Optimist Sports and Grade School Sports through the 8th grade. I watched as he played Football, Basketball, and Baseball at an extremely high level through High School. But he especially excelled in football as a receiver. He never dropped a catchable ball, and many, many times made uncatchable balls look catchable.

Greg Brohm was an outstanding student athlete at Trinity High School in Louisville KY where he excelled in football, basketball, and baseball.

Greg was 1st team All State Wide Receiver (both Associated Press and Courier Journal) at Trinity High School where he teamed up with his brother, All State Quarterback Jeff Brohm, for many important big-time passes.

The Courier Journal selected him the 3rd best receiver in the last 35 to 50 years in the State of Kentucky. (Courier Journal Dec. 26, 1996, Bob White)

Perhaps Greg's best performance would come in 1987 in his Senior Year in High School against a nationally ranked and defending State Champion St. Xavier High School team before approximately 20,000 fans at Louisville's Cardinal Stadium. It was 2nd and 52 yards to go for a 1st down, and Greg caught two passes in a row for the 1st down on the 1 yard line. His brother Jeff ran it in from there for the Touchdown, and Trinity when on to upset the favored Tigers 21 to 0.

In his senior year of high school, Greg caught 51 passes for 893 yards for a team that held the #1 ranking in the state of Kentucky for several weeks. He had a 2 year total of 89 catches for 1,626 yards and 13 touchdowns. Greg was also a valuable contributor on the 1985 Trinity State Championship football team – catching 2 key passes as a sophomore in a playoff comeback from 14-0 down to defeat archrival St. Xavier 17-14.

He also starred in Basketball (starting point guard) and Baseball (starting Outfielder and also at Catcher & pitcher) at Trinity High School. Baseball – 1st Team All 7th Region senior year batting over .400 leading the team in hits, doubles, and stolen bases (Trinity was 7th region runner-up in both Jr. & Sr. yr.)

Greg, a 3-sport athlete, also graduated 2nd in his class of 300+ students at Trinity High School.

He then started at Wide Receiver under Coach Howard Schnellenberger for 3 years at the University of Louisville where he once again teamed up with Jeff Brohm for many passes.

I still remember watching Ray Buchanan, All-American defensive back at the University of Louisville, on TV, when being asked who was the most difficult receiver that he had ever had to cover, he answered "**Greg Brohm**".

Highlights :

Greg was 1st team All State Wide Receiver (both Associated Press and Courier Journal) at Trinity High School where he teamed up with his brother, All State Quarterback Jeff Brohm, for many important passes.

The Courier Journal **selected him the 3rd best receiver in the last 35 to 50 years in the State of Kentucky** (Courier Journal December 26, 1996, Bob White).

He also starred in Basketball (starting point guard) and baseball (starting Outfield and also at Catcher & Pitcher).

Greg **graduated 2nd in his class** at Trinity High School. He was also 1st Team Academic All-State In Football, Basketball, and Baseball.

He was also selected to play in the Kentucky-Tennessee All-Star football game.

He then started at Wide Receiver under Coach Howard Schnellenberger for 3 years at the University of Louisville where he once again teamed up with Jeff Brohm for many passes.

Some of his other highlights are:

Member of the WHAS Radio Broadcast Team for University of Louisville Football games for 10 Years 1994-2003. (Sideline reporter and pre and post-game radio broadcast)

President of the Louisville Fire Arena 2 football team 2002-04. (also was an assistant coach)

Director of Football Operations for University of Louisville Football Team 2004-09 under Coach Bobby Petrino

First Head Football Coach at Thomas Nelson High School – 2 seasons (guiding them through their first two seasons as a school and start-up program). Was also previously an assistant football coach at both Trinity and DeSales high school.

Director of Football Operations for Western Kentucky University Football Team 3 seasons

Chief of Staff & Director of Football Operations at Purdue University – Present

Part of Brohm Family, awarded with the inaugural Howard Schnellenberger Family Award by the Louisville Catholic Sports Hall of Fame.

Has been Host of a Louisville Radio Sports talk show and a Louisville TV Sports talk show.

Dear Committee Members;

With this letter I am recommending Greg Brohm's Nomination and Selection to the KHSAA Hall of Fame.

I played sports with Greg Brohm from peewee leagues through college at the University of Louisville. Greg was one year older than me. We played football, basketball, and baseball together.

Greg excelled in Football, Basketball, and Baseball throughout High School, but he especially excelled as a receiver in football. Greg was my number one receiver when I was playing quarterback and he was playing receiver at Trinity High School.

Greg was 1st team All State Wide Receiver (both Associated Press and Courier Journal) at Trinity High School. In 1996, the Courier Journal selected him the 3rd best receiver in the last 50 years in the State of Kentucky.

As Greg's quarterback for most of his playing career, I was a first-hand witness to his great accomplishments as a player. If the ball was even in his area, he caught it. He made an incredible impact on the Louisville area as the top receiver of his era. He always came up big in the clutch.

Evidence of his clutch performances is the memorable game he had vs. archrival, defending state champion, and nationally ranked St. Xavier in his senior year in 1987. Facing an unbelievable 2nd and 52 yards for a first down, Greg caught two consecutive long passes from me that allowed us to convert that extraordinary distance into a first down. I scored one play later on a short run, and with that series of plays, we had broken the will of the mighty St. X team while inspiring our team with the confidence needed to pull the huge upset. We won that game 21-0 and earned the #1 ranking in the state, which we held for most of that season.

Greg also had huge games versus 3-A state champion Paducah Tilghman (with Mr. Football Kurt Barber), and against Louisville power Fairdale (UK signee Craig Walker) in which he gained around 100 yards receiving each game and was the offensive workhorse of our team.

In his senior year of high school, Greg caught 51 passes for 893 yards for a team that held the #1 ranking in the state of Kentucky for several weeks.

He had a 2-year total of 89 catches for 1,626 yards and 13 touchdowns. Greg was also a valuable contributor on the 1985 Trinity State Championship football team – catching two key passes as a sophomore in a playoff comeback from 14-0 down to defeat archrival St. Xavier 17-14 in a playoff showdown.

Greg also starred in Basketball (starting point guard) and Baseball (starting Outfielder and also at Catcher & Pitcher) at Trinity High School. In baseball, he was our Mr. Versatility – a player who could play every position on the field. A great contact hitter, he did all the little things – get on base, hit line drives, steal bases, catch, pitch, play outfield and infield. He was a 1st Team All-7th Region performer, and, as our lead-off hitter, set the table for me and other hitters in our lineup. In basketball, he ran the team as our point guard and distributed the ball to the open man.

Basically, Greg knew how to win, and did whatever it took to rise to the occasion when a great play was needed.

Greg Brohm was also an outstanding student athlete, **graduating 2nd in his class of over 300 students at Trinity High School**. Academically, he was a whiz, and to this day, I rely on his intelligence and judgment in making decisions each day at Purdue.

After graduating from Trinity, Greg started at Wide Receiver under Coach Howard Schnellenberger for 3 years at the University of Louisville where he once again teamed up with me for many key passes, such as touchdown passes on the road versus Ohio State and Florida. Greg was also a starting wide receiver on the legendary 1991 Fiesta Bowl champion Louisville Cardinal team that defeated Alabama 34-7 on New Year's Day.

After his playing career, Greg has been a key contributor to a variety of successful sports enterprises in the state of Kentucky and beyond. He was Director of Football Operations at U of L under Bobby Petrino, when the Cards garnered 2 Top 10 AP national rankings, won 2 Conference titles, and were champions of both the Liberty and Orange Bowls.

As the Director of Football Operations at Western Kentucky University, he ran the daily operations of our program, and was my top advisor, as we won two consecutive C-USA titles and were the champions of 3 consecutive bowl games.

Along with this success, Greg has also fostered a successful broadcasting career – first as a member of the radio broadcast team of the University

Please accept this as a message of support for Greg Brohm's induction into the KHSAA Dawahares Hall of Fame.

I have known Greg for more than 30 years, from his early days in high school to his role now as Chief of Staff and Director of Football Operations at Purdue University. I know Greg to be a man of high character and solid standing. His commitment to excellence in his personal and professional life meet the standards of this prestigious Hall of Fame.

At Trinity Greg was a leader on and off the playing field, an exceptional student, a gifted athlete and an outstanding person. Greg earned the admiration and respect of fellow students and faculty alike. He was a three-time Shamrock Award winner, a Trinity Scholar, a member of the National Honor Society and a senior retreat leader. At the Class of 1988 Senior Prom, Greg's classmates awarded him the "Mr. Scholarship" and "Mr. Football" Shammy Awards. He went on to graduate second in his class.

A three-sport athlete, Greg excelled at baseball, basketball and football. In baseball he was named to the All-District and All-Region first teams; in basketball he was a starting point guard for the Rocks.

Football, however, was Greg's best sport. He was named to the All-State football team as a wide receiver, played in the Kentucky-Tennessee All-Star Game and was a member of the 1985 state championship team. He was honored by his coaches with the Offensive Captain Award and the Most Valuable Back Award (twice). At the time the Courier-Journal named him the No. 3 all-time high school wide receiver in Kentucky. Greg and his brother Jeff were a powerful wide receiver-quarterback duo.

Greg's athletic ability earned him a football scholarship to the University of Louisville, where he played under coach Howard Schnellenberger. Greg was a three-year starter at wide receiver and a regular member of the Dean's List. In 1991 Greg was a starter in the Cardinals' 34-7 win over the University of Alabama in the Fiesta Bowl, one of the all-time great wins in U of L history. He earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from U of L in 1992.

After college Greg spent nine years at 84WHAS Radio as a member of the U of L broadcast team and as an account executive. In 2002 Greg became president and offensive coordinator of the Louisville Fire arena football team.

In 2004 Greg joined the U of L coaching staff as director of football operations. He eventually left U of L to serve as head football coach at Thomas Nelson High School for two years. He then moved to Bowling Green where he was Director of Football Operations for Western Kentucky University for three years before joining the Purdue staff.

As a Trinity alumnus, Greg continued his dedication to his alma mater. He has served as an assistant football coach, a member of the Alumni Board of Directors, and co-emcee of the Celebration dinner-auction with his brother Jeff. In addition, Greg has been active in charities and community events as a speaker, volunteer and coach.

Greg is assuredly a strong candidate for recognition by our state's premiere high school sports Hall of Fame.

Aside from football, Greg also starred on the baseball diamond and basketball court for the Shamrocks.


Following his successful career at Trinity, Greg went on to play for Coach Howard Schnellenberger at The University of Louisville.
