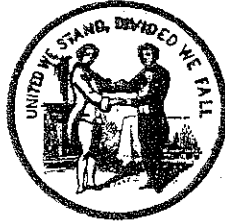
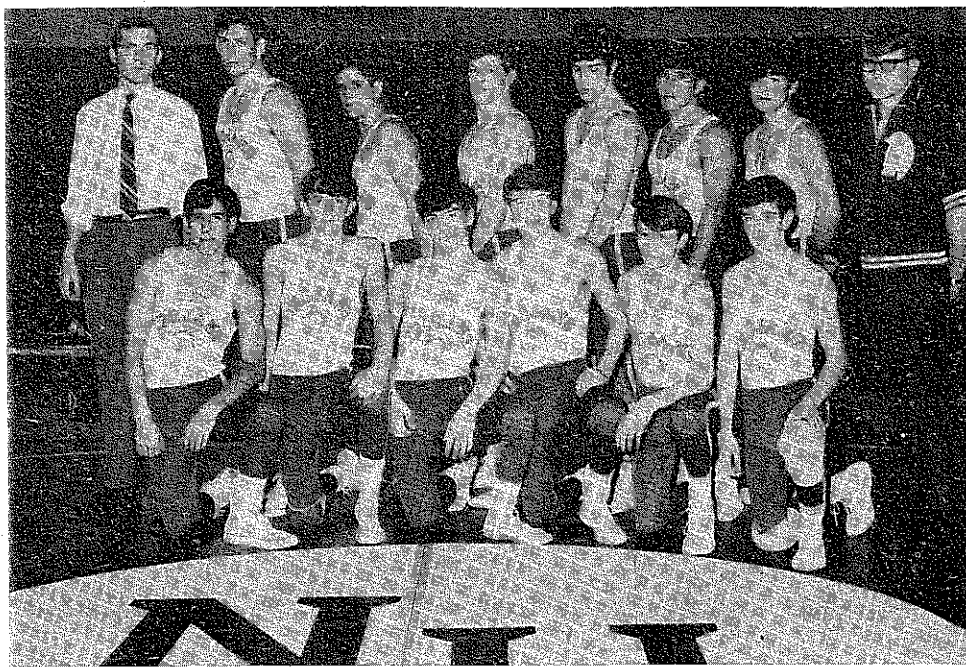

All cheerleaders will then proceed to one of the end entrances where the winners will have easy access to the playing floor.

Sponsors of the competing 16 cheerleader groups are asked to come to the floor with their squads. Besides getting the recognition you so well deserve, it is another way of letting the public know that cheerleading is important enough in the school's curriculum to merit a well-qualified "sponsor-coach-chaperon."

##### K.H.S.A.A. Gymnastics Committee

The meeting was held Wednesday, February 26, 1969, at 7:30 p.m. at the K.H.S.A.A. building.

Mr. Sanford reported that thirteen (13) additional schools have registered gymnastics coaches with the K.H.S.A.A. for the current year.

At its last meeting, the committee had decided to hold the State Gymnastics Meet in Lexington on April 5, 1969. Due to conditions beyond our control the com-

mittee decided to have the State Gymnastics Meet in Louisville again this year with the possibility of moving it to Lexington in 1970. The tentative site is the Iroquois High School.

On recommendation of the committee, Mr. Sanford appointed George Jefferson and Sheila Kuhlman as co-managers of the state meet.

It was decided that, since the meet will be held on April 5, and since the entry deadline is seven (7) days prior to the meet, the entry forms would be mailed to the schools approximately two (2) weeks before the deadline.

The meeting adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

## State Wrestling Tournament

The 1969 State High School Wrestling Tournament was held at the Trinity High School (Louisville) on February 14-15. The North Hardin High School, with 90 points, won the tournament for the second straight year. Ed Brandon of North Hardin was named the meet's "Most Outstanding Wrestler." The Seneca High School was second with 58 points, Trinity High School third with 40 points.

The tournament was managed by Wrestling Committee Chairman Orville Williams of the Seneca High School. It was the sixth tournament sponsored by the K.H.S.A.A.

Teams which scored finished in this order: 1-North Hardin, 90; 2-Seneca, 58; 3-Trinity, 40; 4 (tie)-Fort Campbell and Newport Catholic, 38; 6-Flaget, 37; 7-Kentucky School for the Blind, 33; 8-Westport, 31; 9 (tie)-Jeffersontown and Waggener, 23; 11-Woodford County, 22; 12-Campbell County, 20; 13-Danville, 17; 14 (tie)-Oldham County, Pleasure Ridge Park and Western, 9; 17-Hopkinsville, 8; 18 (tie)-Eastern and Caldwell County, 6; 20-Frankfort, 4; 21-Millersburg Military Institute, 3; 22 (tie)-Fern Creek and Ahrens, 2; 24-St. Xavier, 1.

# North Hardin Wrestling Champ

Unlike the vicious and often brutal wrestlers that perform on television, Seneca High's Barry Amyx takes a more timid approach to the sport.

Amyx, a 17-year-old senior, enters each match with complete respect for the opposition.

"I never overlook an opponent," he said Saturday. "I always wrestle to win, of course, but I try to be a good sport doing it."

Amyx, perspiring freely from the forehead, had just defeated Bruce Thomas of Hopkinsville in the semi-final of the 175-pound division in the eighth annual

State High School Wrestling Tournament which ended Saturday night at Trinity Gym.

"I was just real lucky to get that far," Amyx said later after losing the final match to Trinity's Craig Kissell.

He was being modest, but Amyx did play an important role in Seneca's team finishing second to North Hardin. The Vine Grove school repeated as team champion by posting 90 points. Seneca compiled 58.

Trinity ranked third with 40.

Amyx, who captured 25 of 27 matches this season, advanced to the state meet by winning the 175-pound class in last week's East Jefferson County Regional.

Amyx continued his winning-ways during the state tourney, scoring three victories over a two-day span. The second of his triumphs came over Pleasure Ridge's Mark Lineberry, runner-up to Kissell in last week's West Jefferson County Regional.

"My first loss came in the New Albany Invitational earlier this year," Amyx said. "That has to be the toughest wrestling meet in the area."
