State Wrestling Tournament

The 1971 State High School Wrestling Tournament was held at the Seneca High School on February 19-20. The Fort Campbell High School, with 66 points, won the tournament. Mike Nolan of the Newport Catholic High School and Bernie Head of the North Hardin were named the meet's most outstanding wrestlers. The Waggener High School was second with 57 points and the Flaget High School was third with 56 points.

The tournament was managed by Wrestling Committee Chairman Orville Williams of the Seneca High School. It was the eighth tournament sponsored by the K.H.S.A.A.

In Memoriam



Sam B. Pollock

Samuel Baker Pollock, 68, prominent retired Madisonville educator, civic and church leader, died at his home in Madisonville on February 22, following an illness of several months.

A native of Germantown, Sam Pollock grew up in Pewee Valley, Kentucky. He graduated from Georgetown College in 1923, and accepted a basketball coaching-teaching job at Greenville High School in the fall of that year. He took over the duties as basketball coach-teacher at the Madisonville High School in 1924. He coached the Madisonville football team for several years, later becoming principal and then superintendent of Madisonville schools.

A prominent figure at local, district, regional and state levels in athletics as well as the teaching field, Mr. Pollock was a member of the Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association for the 1946-49 period. For some twenty years he was one of the official scorers at the annual state high school basketball tournament.

In 1956 Mr. Pollock accepted the position of business manager for the Madisonville Trover Clinic. He held that position until his retirement in 1967.

Mr. Pollock was a member of the First Christian Church of Madisonville, serving on the board of deacons of that church. He held membership in K.E.A., N.E.A., Madisonville Country Club, Madisonville Kiwanis Club, Green River District of the Boy Scouts of America, and the Madisonville Elks Lodge. He was a member of the board of directors of the Hopkins County Youth Center, and during World War II was Captain of the Madisonville unit of the Kentucky Active Militia.

Survivors are his wife, Mrs. Billie Pride Pollock; two sons, Richard H. Pollock of Middletown and Samuel B. Pollock, Jr., of Madisonville; and two grandchildren, Steven R. Pollock and Anne Pride of Middletown.

Ft. Campbell wins wrestling crown

When Tommy Miller was a freshman at Flaget, he weighed 70 pounds. And when he said he wanted to try out for the wrestling team, they asked him, "Who are you kidding?"

There is no weight division for 70-pounders and Miller had to wait two years and 15 pounds before they even let him come near the mats.

"We didn't have anybody light enough for him to wrestle," Flaget coach Brother Daniel recalled. "We had to let him wrestle the manager just to keep him happy."

As a junior, he got up to 80 pounds and he finished high in the regional tournament. This year, now up to a scrapping 98 pounds, he won a regional championship.

They hardly could believe it at Flaget because Miller, a senior, makes a jockey look like Minnesota Fats. He gets blown away down Vermont Avenue in mild breezes, and they claim a cleansing tissue can give him a stiff tussle.

And he's a title winner!

Jokes aside, Miller won a state high school championship last night, beating Country Day's Bob Webber in an exciting match for the 98-pound title in the State Tournament at Seneca gym.

It was a dramatic conquest. Miller had beaten Webber four times this year but, with 11 seconds left in the match, he was

behind 5-4 and near disaster. He summoned extra resources to achieve a reversal with eight seconds left that gave him two points and a 6-5 triumph.

Choked with emotion, tears streaming down his face and fighting for control, Miller admitted, "I was never so scared in my life. He put out a better effort than I thought he was capable of."

Miller's coach brought the bracket sheet marking his path to the title and presented it to the onetime 60-pound fullback for St. Cecilia's football team.

"I'm going to use it for wallpaper at home," Miller said.

66 points for Ft. Campbell

Ft. Campbell, grabbing three of the 12 weight titles and taking second in two others, won the team crown as expected. The Falcons from the Army post scored 66 points, with Waggener second at 57 and Flaget a narrow third at 56.

Bernie Head of North Hardin, a bridesmaid the past two years, won the heavy weight in an exciting win over George Skinner of Eastern High. The 220-pound spotted his massive opponent 106 pounds and had to come from behind. Skinner went ahead 2-0 in the second period but Head, who was voted the most valuable wrestler in the meet, pinned 326-pound Skinner with 1:40 left in the final period.

Alan Martin of Western High, who finished in the top three in the state meet

the last two years without winning, made it to the winner's circle in the 145-pound class. He bested Flaget's Ken Siegwald in the best-contested match of the night, winning 5-4. The match was scoreless after the first period but Siegwald went ahead 1-0 with 1:18 left in the second. Martin got the lead at 2-1 before the second period was over, then added three points in the final period.

Both night sessions of the tournament drew capacity crowds of 2,400.
