STATE BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS DRAW - FRIDAY

The draw for the Boys' & Girls' KHSAA Sweet 16® State Basketball Tournaments will be held this Friday, Feb. 8 at the studios of WKYT-TV in Lexington. The draw will be aired live by KYT as a part of its *AfterNoon* news program beginning at 12:30 p.m. (ET).

WKYT-TV will provide a live satellite feed of the draws for outlets across the state. Those television stations wishing to pick up a feed of the broadcast should note that the broadcast time will be from 12:25 p.m. until 1 p.m. (ET) on transponder GE5, Lower 5. Contact WKYT with any satellite feed questions.

Brackets from both draws will be posted on the Association website following the program.

STATE BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT TICKETS

Tickets sales for both the Boys' & Girls' Sweet 16® State Basketball Tournaments continue to be strong, but tickets to both events remain on sale through the KHSAA office by calling (859) 299-5472 or by ordering online at <u>www.khsaa.org</u>.

Tickets for the Boys' State Tournament are \$96 a set in the lower arena (one ticket to each of the 8 sessions) or \$48 a set in the upper arena. Single-session tickets, available in the upper arena only, are also available at \$6 each. There are no single-session lower arena tickets on sale at this time. There is a \$5 handling charge per order. The Boys' State Basketball Tournament is scheduled for March 13-16 at Rupp Arena in Lexington.

Tickets for the Girls' State Tournament are \$96 a set for sideline seats (one ticket to each of the 8 sessions) or \$48 a set for end zone seats. Single-session tickets, available in the end zone only, are also available at \$6 each. There are no single-session sideline tickets on sale at this time. There is a \$5 handling charge per order. The Girls' State Basketball Tournament is scheduled for March 20-23 at Western Kentucky University's Diddle Arena in Bowling Green.

This is a reminder to order your tickets now. Tickets purchased at the arena for either tournament will incur an additional walk-up charge per ticket.

Beginning this year, the State Tournament expands to three days with 32 wrestlers qualifying in each of the 14 weight classes. The State Wrestling Championships are scheduled for Feb. 14-16 at the Farnham Dudgeon Civic Center in Frankfort. State Wrestling Tournament entries, complete with weight-class brackets, will be posted on the Association website the week of the event.

GIRLS' BASKETBALL NOTES

Tish Goldring is averaging 11 points, six rebounds, six steals and seven assists per game for the Bardstown Lady Tigers. As a squad, Bardstown averages 15 steals per game.

Marshall County's Howard Beth, the state's winningest girls' basketball coach, picked up career win No. 600 when the Lady Marshals defeated Mayfield, 75-31, last Tuesday. With a 16-3 record on the year, Beth's career mark now stands at 601-87 in 24 seasons. Beth is one of just 21 girls' coaches to eclipse 600-plus career wins in the country.

Cawood tied a state record with 16 three-point shots made in a 76-50 win over Evarts last Thursday. The Lady Trojanettes connected on 16 of 40 and tied Jenkins (vs. Fleming-Neon, 1997) and Pike Co. Central (vs. Millard, 1998) for the record. Cawood's 40 three-point attempts ranks third-highest for attempts in a game.

Cumberland coach John Bond picked up career win No. 400 when the Lady Skins defeated Corbin, 60-46, last Thursday. With a 9-7 record on the year, Bond's career total stands at 400-173 in his 23rd season. He is only the 13th coach in the state to post 400-plus career-coaching wins in girls' basketball.

Defending All "A" Classic champion Jackson County successfully defended its title last week in Richmond. The Lady Generals posted a 64-41 win in the championship game last Sunday over West Carter. "MVP" Sarah Elliott scored 18 points, pulled down eight rebounds and blocked nine shots in the win. Mason County's Robert Myrick became the 13th member of the Royals' 1,000-point club during Mason County's 94-51 win over Ripley, OH, last week. The 1,000-point club is somewhat of a family affair as Robert's brothers Timmy and Shawn and cousin Larry are also among the elite group.

Sheldon Clark's Adam Brown posted his 1,000th career point back on Jan. 18 against Pike County Central. Despite suffering a 108-89 loss to South Floyd last Saturday, Jeremy Brown put up impressive numbers for the Cards. Jeremy connected on six of eight from the field, nine of 17 from three-point land and three of three from the free throw line for 42 points. He also had six rebounds, four assists and a steal.

After a 9-5 start, Pleasure Ridge Park has won six of its last seven games. Its only loss during that span was a 73-48 loss to Male in the Louisville Invitational Tournament. Terrence Farley has blocked 18 shots in his last four games for the Panthers, six against Butler. PRP is enjoying a four-game winning streak.

Evarts ended an 11-game losing skid to Cawood with an 80-74 win last Friday. Evarts shot 49 percent from the field (29 of 59) and 88 percent from the foul line (16 of 18). Evarts had not defeated Cawood since Jan. 6, 1998. The win also snapped Cawood's 14-game district winning streak.

University Heights picked up its sixth All "A" Classic title with a 58-46 win over Somerset in last Sunday's championship in Richmond. Tournament "MVP" Ravi Moss had 20 points and 12 rebounds for the Blazers.
