STATE SWIMMING & DIVING THIS WEEKEND

The 2002 KHSAA Swimming & Diving State Meet will be held this Friday and Saturday, Feb. 22-23, at the University of Kentucky's Lancaster Aquatic Center in Lexington. Friday's action begins at 10:15 a.m. with preliminary heats in 22 events. The top eight times from the prelims will advance to Saturday's championship heat. Those with next best eight times (Places 9-16) advance to Saturday's consolation heat final.

Boys' & Girls' Diving competition will also be held Friday with prelims and semifinals. The top 16 divers advance to Saturday's finals. Boys' Diving action begins at 2 p.m. on Friday, with the girls' action scheduled to begin at 4:30 p.m.

Saturday's championship competition begins at 11 a.m.

St. Xavier has captured 13 consecutive boys' state team titles and 14 of the last 15. Paul Dunbar is the girls' defending champion, having snapped Sacred Heart's six-year hold on the girls' championship with a win last year.

St. Xavier has 37 overall Boys' State Championships, second nationally only to Honolulu Punahou, HI who has 40. The Tigers' 13 consecutive titles ranks tied for the fifth-longest win streak among national records. On the girls' side, Sacred Heart has 19 overall girls' titles, ranking SHA tied for the sixth-best total among national records.

General admission to the State Meet is \$5 with children six years of age and under admitted free. Fans should park at Commonwealth Stadium in the Blue Lot (marked K) and walk to the Aquatic Center across the street.

REGIONAL SWIMMING HIGHLIGHTS

Some highlights from regional meets include Covington Catholic's Jason Vadney who ranked No. 1 in the state in the 200 Freestyle. Vadney posted a 1:45.68 in regional action and was second in the 500 Free with a time of 4:46.61. Sean Pharr enters the State Meet with the top time in the 100 Free (48.14) and second in the 50 Free (22.32).

St. Xavier, 13-time defending Boys' State Champion, hopes depth will lead the Tigers to their 14th consecutive title. The Tigers qualified the maximum four swimmers in six of the nine individual events and three on the remaining events.

In girls' action, Sacred Heart's Caroline Burckle will have her eye on the oldest standing state record, Kara McGrath's 500 Free mark of 5:57.19 set in 1983. Burckle swam a 4:57.93 in the 2nd Region Meet, breaking Mary T. Meagher's region record by more than two seconds. Burckle also qualified in the 200 Free.

Emile Ewing of Madisonville-North Hopkins and Sarah Menefee of Sacred Heart will hope to better Emily Bresser's state record of 56.71 (1997) in the 100 Back. Ewing was timed in 58.02 at regionals, while Menefee finished in 58.39.

Defending girls' State Champion Paul Dunbar has 18 individual entries that qualified for state action, while runner-up Sacred Heart has 23. DuPont Manual and Notre Dame should also be in the hunt for the Girls' State Championship, having qualified 15 and 21 individual swims.

Overall, 13 All-American consideration times by 10 swimmers were performed during regional meet action.

WOODFORD COUNTY CAPTURES WRESTLING TITLE

Woodford County picked up the school's 11th State Wrestling Championship at the State Wrestling Championships held last Thursday through Saturday at the Capital Plaza Convention Center in Frankfort. It was the Yellowjackets' third title in the last four years and fifth title in the last seven years.

Woodford County tallied 233.5 team points under the first-year eight-place scoring system. Campbell County was second at 163.0, followed by South Oldham at 162.0 and last year's state champion St. Xavier scored 147.0 points.

Woodford County, Oldham County and Simon Kenton each picked up two individual titles. Eric Slugantz (171) and Tyler Baldwin (119) were individual champions for Woodford County. Oldham County's Josh Riordan (160) and Matt Thompson (103) picked up individual titles as well as Craig Cooper (152) and Brad Cooper (130) for Simon Kenton.

St. Xavier's Isaac Knable captured his fourth individual championship with a win in the 145-pound weight class. Knable joins Woodford County's Joe Carr, Jr. and Conner's Robby Clarkson as wrestlers who captured four consecutive state titles.

Despite suffering a 65-64 loss last Friday, Adair County's Kevin Bridgewater enjoyed a great game. Bridgewater scored 40 points, including hitting on 12 of 19 two-point shots and three of five three-point shots. He was also seven of 12 from the free throw line.
