### **DEVRIES NAMED NEXT KHSAA COMMISSIONER**

Brigid L. DeVries will become the sixth Commissioner of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association July 1, 2002, the Board of Control of the KHSAA announced at its meeting on May 15.

"I'm excited about the opportunity to become Commissioner of this Association," DeVries said. "This Association has been successful the last several years and we hope to continue and build on past success."

DeVries becomes the first female to serve as Commissioner of the KHSAA. Currently, three other state association offices have female Executive Directors/Commissioners (Becky Oakes – Missouri; Nina Van Erk – New York; Marie Ishida – California). Sandy Scott was the first full-time female to serve as a Commissioner/Executive Director, holding the position for the New York Association from 1990-2000. Myrna Jones served as an interim director for one year for the Idaho Association from 1987-88.

"I feel the Board of Control continues to show vision and a commitment to diversity with my appointment as the first female Commissioner of the Association. I feel with my experience here at the Association, working with our events and programs and our support groups will allow us to continue to grow," DeVries stated.

DeVries, current Executive Assistant Commissioner of the KHSAA, has served the organization 23 years. Her career with the Association began in 1978 when she was named Assistant Commissioner, becoming just the second female to hold an executive staff position with the KHSAA. Diane Caines served as an Assistant Commissioner from 1976-78. DeVries was promoted to Executive Assistant Commissioner in 1994.

DeVries will succeed current Commissioner Louis Stout, who will retire June 30, 2002 after 31 years of service to the organization, the last eight as Commissioner.

In other action approved by the Board of Control, the Board approved Lexington and Rupp Arena as host of the 2004-2014 Boys' State Basketball Tournaments. Rupp Arena, site of the last eight Boys' State Basketball Tournaments, is slated to entertain the Sweet 16 in 2003. The "Greatest Show in Hoops" has been played at the 23,000-seat facility 19 of the last 24 years.

Eddie Saylor of Bell County Schools was elected president of the Board for the 2002-03 school year, while Paul Dotson of Pike County Schools was elected vice-president. In addition, the Board accepted the resignation of member Dale Stewart of Apollo High School in Owensboro and approved Chuck Broughton, Assistant Principal at Apollo, to complete the final year (2002-03) of Stewart's term.

The Board also voted to discontinue sanctioning an Eight-Player State Championship beginning in 2003. The Board had approved Eight-Player playoffs in 1996 as a means for schools to develop their programs to the 11-Player level. The playoffs were officially sanctioned as a State Championship beginning in 1999 and will continue through 2002.

Only six schools participated in the postseason Eight-Player Championship in 2001. The largest number of participants came in 2000, when eight schools competed.
