SOCCER SEASON BEGINS TODAY

Boys' & Girls' Soccer teams kick off the 2001 season Monday en route to Rawlings Stadium for the State Championships slated for Sat., Nov. 3. Three-time defending girls' state champion South Oldham begins its march for a fourth consecutive title with a game at Assumption on Monday. Defending boys' state champion St. Xavier opens the 2001 season on Monday against Eastern in the Colt Cup Classic at DeSales.

FOOTBALL NOTES FROM WEEK#1

(As provided by member schools)

Defending Class AAAA champion **Male** outlasted Hopkinsville, 41-35, in the Integra Bank Bowl at Trigg County. It wasn't until Male's **Keion Coleman** hauled in a pass in the endzone with just 29 seconds to play until the game was decided. **Sergio Spencer** scored three touchdowns (two rushing and one receiving) and was named the Player-of-the-Game. **Michael Bush** led the Bulldogs' receivers with 96 yards on five receptions and a touchdown. **Chris Barclay** was the leading rusher for Coach Redman's troup, running 11 times for 71 yards and a touchdown. Male quarterback **Brandon Blackerby** completed 15 of 33 passes for 298 yards and three touchdowns.

DeMarcus White had 205 all-purpose yards and four touchdowns in **Madison Southern's** 46-28 win over Whitesburg. **Malachi Maxwell** ran 21 times for 135 yards while scoring two touchdowns and two conversions. Quarterback **Blake Howard** completed his first career touchdown pass with a 12-yard toss to **Matthew Miller**. The catch was also Miller's first career TD reception. On the defensive side for the Eagles, **Derek Hicks** had 12 tackles and a fumble recovery.

Bowling Green's Brad Booker had 10 tackles, four assists and an interception in the Purples' 16-9 loss to Pleasure Ridge Park. Booker was named outstanding defensive Player-of-the-Game.

Pulaski Southwestern set a two school records in its 20-0 win over Nelson County. The Warriors allowed minus-1 yards rushing and only 65 yards total offense to Nelson County – both school records.

Three-time defending Class AAA champion Highlands suffered its first loss to a Kentucky school since 1997 as Henry Clay handed the Bluebirds a 33-12. It was the first loss to a Kentucky team since Highlands lost in double overtime to Covington Catholic in the 1997 playoffs. Four turnovers helped the Blue Devils to the win. **Henry Clay's Marcus Commodore** had five receptions for 153 yards while quarterback **David Buchanan** completed 13 of 17 passes for 287 yards.

FOOTBALL RUNNING CLOCK

This is a reminder/clarification regarding the running clock during football contests. The point differential applies to all football contests. The National Federation's Football Rules Committee made a change in playing rules which permit state associations to adopt a "running clock" when a point differential is attained.

The Football Advisory Committee, with approval of the Board of Control through the Commissioner's office, has approved the following plan for all football playing schools for all levels:

After the first half, any time the score differential reaches 45 points or more, the following changes will be made regarding rules determining when the clock will be stopped and/or started. The clock shall continue to run from the point that the differential occurs (without regard to a later return to less than the differential) with the following clarifications:

1. The clock SHALL STOP when an official's time-out is called as in the following specific 3-5-7 occurrences, and shall subsequently start on the READY FOR PLAY signal:

• For measurement of a possible first down (3-5-7a),

- When captains and coaches are notified of the time remaining (3-5-7d),
- For a player who appears to be injured (3-5-7e and 3-5-10),
- For a player in need of equipment repair (3-5-7f and 3-5-6 and 3-5-5b),
- When a coach-referee conference occurs (3-5-7i and 3-5-11),
- After a foul, to administer a penalty (3-5-7j),
- For any unusual delay in getting the ball ready to play (3-5-7k),

• For the one minute intermission between the 1/2 quarters and 3/4 quarters, or following the try, successful FG or safety. (3-5-7m),

• A score occurs. Following a try, field goal, or safety, the clock shall start on the ready for play. Following a 6-point touchdown, the clock shall remain stopped for the PAT, but shall resume on the ready for play for the ensuing kickoff,

2. The clock SHALL STOP when an official's time-out is called as in the following specific 3-5-7 occurrences, and shall subsequently start on the SNAP:

- For unusual heat or humidity which may create a health risk to the players (3-5-7h),
- For an approved TV/radio time-out (3-5-7l),
- A charged time-out is called (3-5-1, 3-5-2, 3-5-3, 3-5-4, 3-5-5),
- At the end of a period

3. The clock SHALL NOT STOP when an official's time-out is called as in the following specific 3-5-7 occurrences:

- When a first down is declared (3-5-7-b),
- Following a change of team possession (3-5-7c and 3-5-9),
- To dry or change the game ball (3-5-7g)

NOTE: The use of this rule does not preclude the use of NFHS Rule 3-1-3 that reads: "A period or periods may be shortened in any emergency by agreement of the opposing coaches and the referee. By mutual agreement of the opposing coaches and the referee, any remaining periods may be shortened at any time or the game terminated."
