FOOTBALL NOTES FROM WEEK#5

(As provided by member schools)

Lawrence Arnold of Ballard Memorial ran for 176 yards on four carries and two touchdowns, and caught two passes for 72 yards and a touchdown in a 21-8 win over Crittenden County.

Bardstown's John Wesley Monin completed eight of 12 pass attempts for 308 yards and four touchdowns while playing only the first half of the Tigers' 67-7 win over Western. **Jared Lefaivre** had three receptions for 121 yards and two touchdowns in the win.

In five games this year, **Bowling Green's Aaron Johnson** has accounted for 823 yards from scrimmage. Johnson has 439 yards rushing on 49 carries, has caught 13 passes for 321 yards, and has thrown a 63-yard touchdown.

Calloway County's Jimmy Bynum, in a 55-0 win over Lone Oak, scored three touchdowns rushing, caught a pass for a touchdown, returned an interception for a touchdown, and rushed for a two-point conversion.

During **Covington Catholic's** 41-7 win over Cincinnati LaSalle (OH), running back **Sean Ryan** had 209 yards on 28 carries, scored three times, and recovered a fumble on special teams.

In four games this season for Doss, punter D.J. Mulhall has punted 17 times for 682 yards, an average of 40.1 yards-per-kick.

Garrard County's Montice Quisenberry ran 21 times for 272 yards and four touchdowns in a 34-20 win over Carroll County. **Ivan Isaacs** recorded 11 tackles and two sacks in the win. **Seth Riley** added two tackles.

Glasgow will be trying for its 500th win in school history when it plays Friday night against Hart County. Glasgow is 3-1 on the year.

Mark Dunn of **Harrodsburg** broke the school record for rushing yards in a single game when he ran for 419 yards Friday in a 53-27 win over Paris. Henry Parks held the old record of 406 yards, set in 1976 against Berea.

Friday night, **Henderson County's Tanner Siewert** tied the school record with his sixth field goal of the season in a 52-12 win over Christian County. Siewart has connected on 19 consecutive point-after-attempts.

In an 18-14 win over Scott County, **Henry Clay** linebacker **Will Wheeler** had 20 tackles while **Antwon Jones** recovered a fumble and returned it 64 yards for a touchdown.

Highlands' senior running back **Matt Gramstad** had 358 all-purpose yards and five touchdowns in a 42-16 win over Beechwood. Matt carried the ball nine times for 236 yards and three touchdowns, had one reception for 38 yards and a touchdown, and two punt returns for 74 yards and a touchdown.

Owensboro Catholic's Kevin McGraw tied a school record Saturday with three touchdown receptions in a 35-14 win over Butler County.

Madison Southern's Demarcus White, in a 47-45 overtime win at Wayne County, scored four touchdowns and a two-point conversion. Demarcus returned two kickoffs for touchdowns of 90 and 92 yards. He also ran for a 12-yard touchdown, caught a 9-yard pass for a touchdown, and converted a two-point conversion. **Andrew Pace** hauled in three touchdown receptions (5, 12 and 17 yards). Pace finished the night with eight receptions for 137 yards and three touchdowns.

Male's Brandon Blackerby completed eight of nine passes for 217 yards and three touchdowns in a 63-14 win over Atherton. **Mike Bush** had three receptions for 86 yards and two touchdowns. Chris Barclay ran twice for 22 yards and two touchdowns and had two receptions for 67 yards and a touchdown.

The **Mason County Royals** have won their first five football games of the season for the first time in school history. Mason County defeated Russell, 27-14, last week for its fifth consecutive win.

Paul Dunbar's Corey Dunn has put together four consecutive 200-yard games rushing and is now at 966 yards for the season. Dunn is vastly approaching the school's single season rushing record of 1,281 yards.

In a 38-16 win over Central Hardin, **Pleasure Ridge Park's Matt Bruederle** ran five times for 90 yards and two touchdowns. **Jacob McBroom** had 18 tackles including four sacks for a minus 59 yards.

Prestonsburg's defense held Portsmouth East (OH)'s offense to just 53 total yards in a 41-6 win over the weekend.

Desmond Harris ran 17 times for 221 yards and three touchdowns (94, 81 and 44 yards) as Warren Central defeated Daviess County, 28-20. Harris also had an interception on defense for the Dragons.
