KHSAA BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association will hold a special meeting Sat., Dec. 1, at 8 a.m. at the Executive Inn in Louisville. The Board will be discussing proposals submitted by member schools to be presented to the Annual Delegate Assembly meeting on Jan. 9, 2002 in Lexington. Proposals to be presented will be posted on the Association website at a later date prior to the Delegate meeting.

FOOTBALL NOTES FROM PLAYOFF WEEK#4

Male ended Owensboro's 32 game home winning streak and earned a return to the Class AAAA State Championship with a 23-6 win over the Red Devils. Chris Barclay scored twice on runs of 29 and 26 yards for the defending Class AAAA State Champions. Barclay ran 18 times for a total of 151 yards while Sergio Spencer ran 10 times for 51 yards. Spencer closed out the Bulldog's scoring, returning an interception 40 yards for a touchdown with 50.2 second remaining. Todd Flannery converted a 20-yard field goal and two PATs. In his first game at quarterback for the injured Brandon Blackerby, Michael Bush completed two of eight passes for 47 yards.

INSTANT REPLAY

Two of this year's four Class State Championships are a rematch from last year. Danville and Newport Central Catholic in Class A and Male and Trinity (Louisville) in Class AAAA will battle for the State Championship for the second consecutive year. Danville topped Newport Central Catholic last year, 23-9, while Male defeated Trinity (Louisville), 34-14.

BOYLE COUNTY WINNING STREAK

Boyle County's 28-21 win on the road over Hopkinsville ran the school's consecutive winning streak to 44, second highest in state football history. The Rebels now trail only Trinity (Louisville)'s string of 50 consecutive wins accomplished from 1988-91.

Boyle County's last loss was a 28-13 decision to Lexington Catholic in the second round of the Class 2A playoffs in 1998.
