## WARREN CENTRAL WINS IN BOYS' BASKETBALL

Warren Central picked up the school's first State Basketball Championship with a 66-56 win over defending champion Mason County to win the National City/KHSAA Boys' State Basketball Tournament. Mason County, attempting to become the first school to win back-to-back titles since Fairdale in 1990 and 1991, saw its bid to repeat come one

game short. After surviving a triple overtime thriller against Trinity (Louisville) in the quarterfinals and an overtime win a semifinal match-up over Scott County, the Royals fell behind early and could never recovered in the championship.
