STATE GOLF TOURNAMENTS

Golf takes center stage this week with State Tournament action. The Girls' State Golf Tournament is scheduled for Oct. 7-8 at Bellefonte Country Club in Ashland. Monday, Oct. 6 will serve as the practice round day. The Boys' State Golf Tournament is scheduled for Oct. 9-10 at Eagle Trace Golf Course in Morehead. Wednesday, Oct. 8 will serve as practice day for the boys' event.

Defending champions St. Xavier (boys) and Assumption (girls) qualified among the field of teams. Marci Turner of Monroe County and Laura Caniff of Russell are the top two individuals returning from last year's tournament that will be in action. Turner was fourth and Caniff was fifth in last year's event. Both enter as regional champions as Turner fired a 67 to win the Fifth Region title. Caniff was on her game in firing a 71 to win the 10th Region individual title.

Tedd Collins of Ballard and Matt Savage of St. Xavier are the top two individuals returning from last year's tournament. Both finished four shots out of the lead last year in a three way tie with Somerset's Justin Moore for second place. Savage captured last week's Seventh Region title carding a 70 while Collins was firing a 72 in the regional.

FB WEEK #7 NOTES

(As taken from member school reports)

Kevin Smith of Newport Central Catholic ran 29 times for 302 yards and three touchdowns in a 33-29 win over Beechwood. In addition, Smith had two receptions for 16 yards. On defense, he had two tackles, broke up a pass and had one tackle for loss.

Clint Perry of Perry County Central ran just six times for a whopping 202 yards and two touchdowns in a 35-0 win over Knox Central. Al Holland completed 12 of 21 passes for 200 yards and three touchdowns. Donn Thomas had seven receptions for 113 yards and a touchdown. Daniel Smith led the Commodores on defense with 13 tackles as Perry Central recorded the school's first shutout in football.

Presley Marshall ran 14 times for 301 yards and four touchdowns for Fleming County in a 52-36 win over Estill County. Marshall also had a 12-yard touchdown reception. Jordan Fritz completed 13 of 17 passes for 144 yards and a touchdown.

Shawn Robbins ran 28 times for 274 yards and four touchdowns for Bell County in a 50-21 win over Madison Southern. As a team, Bell County ran 57 times for a whopping 554 yards.

Josh Adkins was one touchdown shy of tying Aaron Anderson's 1993 mark of six touchdowns in a game in Whitley County's 71-36 win over Montgomery County. Adkins ran for four touchdowns and returned a kickoff 85 yards for the other. Whitley's 71 points broke the school record for points in a game, surpassing the old mark of 68 set against Knox Central in 1999. In the game, Whitley had eight first downs, but scored 11 touchdowns.
