## LEXINGTON CHRISTIAN CAPTURES STATE BASEBALL

The Lexington Christian Eagles captured the school's first state baseball title with a 7-0 win over defending state champion Christian County before a state record crowd of 3,912 at the 2005 Fifth Third/KHSAA State Baseball Championship held last week at Applebee's Park in Lexington. Attendance for the week also set a record with 14,955 fans passing through the turnstiles over the four days.

Leading 1-0, Lexington Christian posted six runs in the third as it banged out four hits after two were out and made the most out of two errors by Christian County. Jimmy Stanley of LCA went the distance, allowing just three hits while striking out eight and walking just two.

LCA used a two-out single by Kruger in the bottom of the seventh to rally to defeat Owensboro Catholic in the opening game of the tournament. The Eagles then handed Trinity (Louisville) a 5-2 loss in the semifinals to advance to the championship.

Christian County's big bats paced the Colonels to the championship with an 8-2 win over Harrison County in the opening round and then a 6-1 win over Boyd County in the semifinals. The Colonels managed just three hits while committing five errors in the championship loss to Lexington Christian.
